### Twentieth Annual Report

Gentlemen,

It is with great pride and pleasure that, on behalf of your President and Committee, I present for your adoption this the Twentieth Annual Report and Financial Statement of your Club.

The past six years have been very trying ones, and we are thankful indeed that peace has once again been restored throughout the world.

While many of our older members have been serving their country it has been left to the younger members to uphold the high ideals and traditions set in the days of peace. This they have done in no uncertain manner, and in doing so have covered themselves with glory by establishing their Club as the premier Life Saving Club in South Australia for the season 1944-45.

Your Executive Committee is proud to announce that once again there were no fatalities at the beach under our care—a fact which speaks volumes for the vigilance and efficiency of all members.

With the continued and added interest of every member, your Club can look forward to the coming season with the confidence and knowledge that the object of any Life Saving Club—the saving of lives on the beaches—will be maintained at the highest possible standard.

#### AFFILIATIONS.

The Club is again affiliated with the following bodies:—The Royal Life Saving Society (S.A. Head Centre), the South Australian Amateur Swimming Association.

#### LIFE SAVING.

The following is a summary of the report submitted by the Patrol Captain (T. Barnes):—

Henley was again efficiently patrolled by our members.

A very noticeable feature this season was the increase in patrol hours. The total hours spent on patrol by members was 127 as against 96 last season.

Individual rescues for the season totalled 17 and assistance was given to another 8 persons.

During the season several picnics were held at Henley, and wherever possible a patrol was maintained for their benefit.

That such patrols are necessary was evidenced by the fact that T. Jennings was responsible for saving the life of one of the children from the Lockleys School.

Another instance worthy of mention in this report was that of G. Cleal, who successfully applied his knowledge of resuscitation to a man who had been brought ashore from an upturned boat.

M. Barltrop was credited with 15 hours on patrol, and as a result gained the trophy presented to the member spending the most hours on patrol duty.

on our Captain (F. C. Hill) and Chief Instructor (M. B. Butterfield), who were directly responsible for the smartness and efficiency of the teams representing the Club.

#### LONG SWIMS.

As in previous years, the Club was represented in the Annual Long Swims conducted by the Amateur Swimming Association of South Australia, and while none of our members were successful in annexing any of these races, some really good performances were registered.

Swim through Adelaide-R. Forester, a new member of the Club, swam very strongly to finish in seventh position.

Henley to Grange-In this, the longest open water swim in Australia, A. McDonough, from the 4½ minute mark, swam in fine style to gain second place.

Swim through Rosewater-This proved to be the hardest long swim of the season, and our congratulations are extended to M. Butterfield and A. McDonough, who finished fourth and seventh respectively.
