Gentlemen.

The President and Committee have pleasure in presenting the 25th Annual Report and Financial Statement.

Again the season's results are a credit to members. The Club participated very successfully in five Carnivals, and for the second successive year were unbeaten in the Rescue and Resuscitation Event.

Patrol hours have increased and it is pleasing to report that no drowning fatalities occurred at our beach. Rescues totalled 20; this alone speaks well of the efficiency of members.

Easily the most pleasing feature of the season is the renewed activity in the Junior Section; from no junior membership last season we now have 12 lads, and although most of them did not sign up till late in the season we will have the material to work on next season.

LIFE SAVING

Patrol Captain D. Hemsley has supplied the following report:-

During the past season efficient Patrols were posted and an increased number of Jetty and Beach Patrol hours were recorded: the season's total hours being 216, an increase of 28 hours on last season. However, 216 hours does not include the many hours spent patrolling and rescuing per medium of the surf boat. Next season Boat and Beach Patrols will be incorporated in the one patrol report.

Although several Sunday beach carnivals were held, requiring a large percentage of members to be away from Henley, an adequate patrol was always left to look after the public.

A total of 20 persons were rescued (an increase of two on the previous season), F. O'Connell leading the way with four rescues. A notable feature was the complete justification of the purchase of the surf boat, which was used to assist the crews of numerous capsized yachts.

Our tireless Patroller, Max Aitchison, although illness caused his absence for part of the season, again recorded most individual patrol hours with a total of 213 hours. Captain Sam Roberts was a close second with 20 hours.

SURF BOAT REPORT

Supplied by the Surf Boat Captain, Jim Doherty.

The Boat, A. W. Jolly II, was officially named and launched by Mrs. A. W. Jolly on November 6th, and within three weeks had been instrumental in saving a lad from almost certain drowning when his leaky canoe had been blown over a mile out to sea.

Many hours were spent of a week-end and during holidays patrolling swimmers, and several rescues were made during these patrols; numerous yacht crews were also given assistance. Four sharks were sighted on patrols and the alarm signalled from Boat to Jetty Patrol, who sounded the siren.

The most exciting experience with the boat was the battle with a shark on February 26th. The shark, which had been seen for several days close in shore, was speared near the head and made out to sea.

An hour or so later, it again appeared swimming towards shore. The boat was launched, and after jockeying for position for some time it was again speared deep in the side, throwing itself out of the water to dislodge the spear and heading for sea leaving a trail of blood. That night it was reported washed ashore at West Beach.

Members have every confidence in the boat, which they believe will amply fill the needs of this Club and beach for some years to come. It is an all-weather craft and the lads will take it out in the roughest weather if there is a job to be done.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the members for their assistance in transporting the boat to and from the shed, and particularly those who have helped in its maintenance.

During the season K. Thorsen found it necessary to resign, and F. O'Connell was elected to the vacancy.

PROPOSED NEW CLUBHOUSE

The Management Committee at its meeting on 14/3/50 decided to inaugurate a Building Fund. Bonds to the value of £300, which the Club had recently purchased, were transferred to the Fund, and in the three months since the idea originated a further £200 has been invested in bonds and credited to the Fund.

A deputation waited on the Henley and Grange Council, and the Club has been told that a site in close proximity and north of the present shed will be made available for the building of a new clubhouse (the first major step).

The present intention is to erect a double-storey building which will be a credit to the town and a place where ex-members may gather and "pound one and another's ears" over old times. The present members consider that after years of free unselfish service to the public the "old hands" are at least deserving of a place to meet their former cobbers in their leisure hours.

We realise that it will possibly be four to five years before we will be in a position to build, so our aim in the meantime is to raise at least £4,000.

Swing Nights in the "Tivoli" are providing a good source of revenue for the Club, and in future proceeds will be credited to the Building Fund.

We have been told we're aiming too high, but we have confidence in our ability to see the job through. Remember the Surf Boat—"You'll never raise £300," sceptics said. In 18 months we had the boat ready for launching—we'll do it again.

This time next year we expect to be well above the first £1,000.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Hon Treasurer G. W. King has supplied the following report:-

"It gives me considerable pleasure to present the twenty-fifth Annual Financial Statement. This season we have added a balance sheet to our records, and I'm certain everyone connected with the Club will agree it makes very good reading. Hard work has been rewarded and still harder work is ahead if we are to achieve our next major goal—a new and up-to-date clubhouse.

A total of £500 has been invested in Commonwealth Bonds this year and credited to the Building Fund.

This financial success of the Club, I feel, is due to the energetic work of the Committee in organising Swing Nights, etc. The Ladies' Committee and other generous helpers who assisted with the Badge Day and the numerous donors to Club funds, both large and small.

In conclusion, I wish to thank all who have assisted the Club and hope they will continue to give us their support in the years to come.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The twenty-fourth Annual General Meeting of the Club was held in the Council Chambers, Henley Town Hall, on Friday, 2nd September, 1949, at 8 p.m.

President A. H. J. Hallett, Esq., presided over the meeting, which was attended by 29 members. The Secretary, C. Fielder, presented the twenty-fourth Annual Report, and Treasurer G. King the Financial Statement; both of these were duly received and adopted.

Mr. G. P. Speirs, representing the Royal Life Saving Society, was welcomed by the President and gave a short, intresting talk on life saving.

The following amendments were made to the Club Constitution:-

- (1) Rule 4c amended by deleting the words "Before entering the Club all prospective Juniors are to complete the 100 metres test swim in 2 min. 20 sec." and inserting "within three months of acceptance of nominations Junior members shall complete the 100 metres test swim in 2 mins. 30 secs."
- (2) Rule 4a of the Junior Section of the Constitution amended by deleting the words "swim 100 metres in 140 seconds in the Henley Baths before acceptance of nomination" and inserting "swim 100 metres in 150 seconds in the Henley Baths within three months of acceptance of nomination."

(A new revised constitution book will be printed shortly after the Annual Meeting.)

REUNION SOCIAL

This function was again held in the "Green Dragon" late April. Nearly 50 past and present members attended and gave one another the biggest "ear pounding" ever.

Exploits of the past caused quite a few of the present members to raise their eyebrows, while comments such as "How are these young blokes?" were frequently uttered by the old hands.
