Gentlemen,

The President and Committee have pleasure in presenting the 29th Annual Report and Financial Statement.

This season when all the regulars had gathered together on the foreshore in October, they had before them the task of erecting the Nissen Hut so kindly supplied by the Henley and Grange Council. All that the boys had was a heap of wood and iron and the site on which to build the hut. Under the leadership of the Club Captain (Frank O'Connell) and Chief Instructor (Tom Jennings) the work was duly carried out, and most club members did their fair share towards the building of our temporary home. The hut measured 35 ft. x 16 ft., and into this 64 members, 1 surf boat, 5 reels, plus first aid equipment, etc., had to be placed, whilst locker accommodation had to be found for all members. True to form, the Henley boys found a way, and by mid-November we were established in our new home. In his report the Club Captain is full of praise for all members who assisted him during the season.

CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The general discipline and performances of the Club members this season was good with few exceptions, especially as, on numerous occasions during the season they were called upon to do far more than usual, but the majority never failed to respond.

Once again this season was a successful one in the competition field, and the Henley flag is still at the top of the mast. The Management Committee once again worked well for the Club, and it was pleasing to see younger men on the committee taking an active part. In summarising my report I can only thank all members for their full co-operation, without which my job would have been impossible.

Although the figures show that our Senior Active membership was slightly down, our Juniors have increased their number from eleven to twenty, which is a very good sign indeed.

STATE REPRESENTATIVES

Again this season Henley was well represented in both teams that made Interstate trips for the purpose of competition. Firstly in the Southern States Carnival Team that went to Torquay to compete against New Zealand, Victoria and Tasmania, W. Salisbury, P. Abbott, M. and F. Tucker were successful in gaining a place in the side, while T. Jennings was appointed State Coach. Unofficially, junior members T. Park, W. Temby, and Michael Hocking represented the State in the Junior R. & R. event at this carnival.

In the team that competed in the Australian Championships at Southport, Queensland, F. O'Connell and Tony Park were successful in gaining selection. In addition, Merv. Butterfield was elected coach of this team. Congratulations, fellows, keep the good work going.

PATROL CAPTAIN'S REPORT

To cover all the facts contributing to this unusual season I have written more than is customary for a report of this nature, and to avoid confusion of these facts I have segregated this report into the following three sections.

PATROLS

1953-54 proved to be one continuous season of abnormal weather which, though at times warm enough to draw good beach crowds, did not entice the usual number of swimmers seen in past seasons. Patrols, however, had to be maintained and were carried out efficiently by all members. Another deterrent to swimming, though to a lesser degree was the state of our beach following last year's storm. Higher tides have uncovered much broken concrete, rubble and glass. The Club first aid equipment was used quite extensively. Each patrol was increased this season to four members, comprising three bronze holders and one non bronze holder. Though not permitted to be actively engaged in rescue work, I feel that these lads have learnt the fundamental concepts of patrol work, and this should stand to their credit when they are qualified.

Patrols were lengthened to an hour and a half and the fixed patrol system of past seasons was replaced by week-to-week rostering. The adoption of this latter system ensures that members will do an equal, or near equal, number of patrol hours. Results justified expectations because 20 members finished with only 2½ hours separating the first and twentieth. The extensive changes made to the patrol system were very successful, and this can be attributed to the splendid co-operation of all the lads.

Brice Menzies recorded the most Senior Patrol hours with 13½ hours, and Michael Hocking had the best tally of the Juniors with 11 hours and 40 minutes. The following tables outline the season's Patrol activities.

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RESCUES

Rescues decreased this season to 15 from last year's total of 31. This is a reflection of the fewer swimmers already mentioned. Ian Worth, a promising junior, recorded a triple rescue, and this meritorious effort gained him the most rescues. Older members will be interested to know that popular Life Member Ced. "Pud" Hele effected a rescue during Christmas. Four yachtsmen were rescued with the surf boat and details of this rescue are set out in the boat captain's report. While referring to our boat, I must endorse my predecessors' remarks regarding its value in rescue work.

Four children were rescued on different occasions by members of the public at varying times during the early evening. All were treated by Club members and one, a girl of seventeen years, required an hour's treatment on the ever-reliable "Eve-Rocker" before she recovered. There were no fatalities at Henley this season, which is proof that the lads have worthily upheld their Club motto: "Vigilance and Service."

GEAR AND EQUIPMENT

The season opened with most gear housed far and wide for safe-keeping following the May storm, and the erecting of our temporary quarters occupied much time usually devoted to maintenance work. Consequently our equipment was not in 100% condition when the first carnival was held on December 13th, and the increased number of carnivals that followed prevented much from being done, especially to the reels. However, all equipment will be in A1 condition for the coming season.

A new ski was purchased in December and, like the old one, which has been repaired, was set aside specifically for patrol work. The usefulness of surf skis in this capacity cannot be over stated, as they are ideal for patrolling our type of beach where swimmers are spread over large areas.

Other new acquisitions are a beach shelter, two 500 yard waxed lines and a boat trailer. A full report on the boat trailer is given by the boat captain. This season the standard patrol cap of the Australian Surf Association made its debut on our beach. This cap of red and yellow halves is easily discernible to the public and the Club has acquired two dozen. Finally, another change this year was the adoption of a new design for the Club competition caps. Three dozen of these have been made to replace the old stocks. Many thanks to Mrs. Butterfield, who made such a good job of them. To close this report I must thank all members for their assistance and co-operation during the season.

The teams competing consisted of two men, one doing a patient swim and the other a belt swim; each man then completed a one-man carry and resuscitation drill.

This year the Club Championships were conducted under difficulties. The first attempt was abandoned after climatic conditions proved too difficult for the three teams who lined up. When the second attempt was made the following Saturday only ten starters could be found. This time the lines fouled on concrete rubble which last years storm had washed out. BOAT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

In its fifth year, the A. W. Jolly II has once again rendered valuable service to both the public and the Club. Ten hours' patrol were recorded by boat crews during the season, but only one rescue was necessary. This rescue was on the 10th of January, when two disabled yachts were sighted, approximately 400 yards off shore by the beach patrol. Both yachts had broken masts and had to be towed to the shore.

As boat races were included in our latter carnivals, a boat trailer was purchased to facilitate transport of our boat to them. As the other clubs are now purchasing their own boats, it has become noticeable that our own Club has become more boat minded. Whenever a decent sea is rolling there is always a crew ready to have a go at "cracking a few." Now as we have no experienced boat men in the Club some very spectacular crashes occurred. One incident that must be recorded happened on the 21st of March, when Merv. Butterfield took a crew out. There was a heavy sea running this day and, when they attempted to get off the beach, they caught a back-shoot. In doing so the sweep oar dug into the sand and snapped in two. The boat then turned sideways and rolled over. Another amusing incident, although at the time it was not amusing to the crew, occurred down at Port Noarlunga by the mouth of the river. This time Tom Jennings had a crew out. After a couple of mediocre shoots, they climbed aboard a real boomer. This proved too much for them to handle, and after broaching the wave the boat rolled completely over.

Space does not permit me to describe all the surf boat happenings this season, but I would like to thank my deputy and all those who have helped with the boat during the past season.
