CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

During this season the Club has maintained its high standard, whether in examinations, patrol work, or competition, the Club Championships proving a good measuring stick of this point, as the winner, Tony Page, and the runner-up were only deducted 4.10 and 5.50 respectively for a complete Bronze Examination. Incidentally Tony and the runner-up, Ron Battersby, are both Junior members, and are to be congratulated for downing the Seniors in such an event.

In competition the lads proved they were still well to the fore, particularly on Championship Day, when they scooped the pool with the following results: Junior R. and R., 1st. Junior Belt Race: A. Page, 1st; B. Robinson, 3rd. Junior Teams Race, 1st (Page, Reed, Robinson, and Jacobson). Junior Surf Race: A. Page, 1st; W. Reed, 3rd. Senior Belt Race: J. Hamilton, 1st; M. Garrety (unofficial 3rd), T. Park, 4th. Senior Teams Race, 1st (Hamilton, Park, Tucker, J. Salisbury). Senior Surf Race: M. Garrety (unofficial) 1st; A. Park, 2nd; J. Hamilton (equal) 3rd. A notable omission from this imposing list is once again the Senior R. and R. title, which once again eluded us, although for the fourth successive season we have proved to be the most consistent team on the coast by winning the Ampol Shield.

It will be noted that Murray Garrety was prominent in the swimming events on Championship Day, so much so that, in spite of extreme opposition from various sources, forced his way into the State team to compete at Bondi in April. His performance at these Australian championships was excellent, and besides winning the first Surf Title ever for S.A., that is the Australian Open Surf Championship, he also assisted the State team to gain third position in the Interstate Competition, the highest position it has ever held. Murray also swam into second place in the Australian Belt Title, and very nearly brought off the "double." It is difficult to see why so many "surf sports" opposed his selection, and, in fact, are still carrying a chip on their shoulder.

Whilst on the subject of the Australian Championships, one cannot overlook the performance of Tony Page, who gained third position in the Junior Belt Title. Tony justly deserved his reward, as he has trained hour after hour throughout the season, and is indeed a fine example for any of the members to follow.

In conclusion, I must mention the outstanding work during the season of Ron Hill in his instruction to the Bronze squads. His has been an arduous task, but has had outstanding results.

Mention must also be made of the efforts of Tom Jennings, who has been responsible for the raising of many a shilling over the past six months with his fortnightly shows.

May I also thank the Management Committee and members, particularly the cadets, for their co-operation during the season, and wish the Club the best for the future.

CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT

I have pleasure in reporting on the Club's activities for the past season in the competitive field and the awards gained.

At the start of the season our prominent seniors were competing in the State team for two carnivals, thus leaving us a weakened side to contest the Ampol Shield.

The Selection Committee decided to enter the Junior Team in both the Senior and Junior R. and R. events. Full credit must go to these juniors for gaining points in the two carnivals, thus giving the now reformed senior team the chance to win the Ampol Shield in the remaining carnivals. The seniors won all remaining carnivals and retained the Ampol Shield for the fourth consecutive year.

The high standard of our seniors in the R. and R. was shown when, from our training squad of eight, six of these were chosen as State representatives to contest the Australian titles at Bondi. Credit here, I feel, must go to their instructor, Sam Roberts.

Although winning minor carnivals, we were unfortunate in filling second place to Port Noarlunga in the State Championships at Christies Beach. The winning margin was .2. Well done, Port Noarlunga.

To offset the seniors' defeat, the Junior R. and R. team won the perpetual trophy and State Championship, and we look forward to their promotion to senior ranks next season and the competition that they will create among our own Club members.

Good performances were put up by all lads competing in the State Championship, the outstanding ones being Tony Page in winning both the Junior Surf and Junior Belt Race, and Jim Hamilton (The Ox) in winning the Senior Belt Race.

Our awards gained this season were 6 Bronzes, 6 Qualifying Certificates, and 1 Instructor's Certificate.

In conclusion, I wish to congratulate all the members on their achievements, and thank the instructors for the co-operation and assistance they gave me throughout the season.

The Australian Surf Championships for 1956 were held in Torquay, Victoria, in conjunction with the Olympic Games in Melbourne, the Interstate Competition taking place on Sunday, 25th November, and the actual Australian Championships on Sunday, 2nd December. Because of the fact that some of our members were competing on both week-ends, quite a large party of our members spent a very pleasant week or so in Victoria. Those fortunate enough to be chosen in the State side were J. Hamilton, A. Park, A. Page, and F. Tucker, whilst D. Hemsley was appointed manager of the side. These members, together with H. Holmes and the Club President, Jim Doherty, were all present at Torquay for the whole week, whilst an additional contingent, comprising R. Powell, M. Jenkins, B. Jeffs, R. Battersby, B. Robinson, and M. Griffiths arrived there for the second week-end. Sig Jacobson, who was in Melbourne watching the "Games," also found his way to our headquarters.

AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

BONDI BEACH, APRIL 20, 21, 1957

Title.

We arrived in Sydney at about 8 a.m. on Sunday, 14th, and proceeded to our lodgings at the Bondi Pacific Hotel, overlooking Bondi Beach. You could not wish for a better view than the one from the pent-house.

After breakfast and the unpacking, I took the lads down to renew old friendships at the Bondi Clubhouse. The lads, mouths open at first, soon settled down and found some new mates. I had to leave them for an hour or so while I had a look at the proposed accommodation for the Port Noarlunga lads, with our good friend and resident delegate, Tom Meagher. When we returned the lads had just about taken over Bondi.

After loosening our cramped bus journey muscles on the Sunday, we all dined out (only in a cafe though), and lapped up all that television had to offer.. Arrangements were made next day for some of the best "Surf Brains" of Bondi to show the lads how. This programme was followed throughout the rest of the week, together with instruction by Dave Hemsley, who managed to run the lads through some drill work after he had finished his duties with the State team.

Prior to the arrival of the State team I arranged for our party to view various radio and television shows in production.. I think all enjoyed the opportunity of seeing Messrs. Dyer and Davey at work, and although these trips meant losing a day of our sightseeing, it was compensated for to some extent by being photographed with Bob (Pick-a-Box) Dyer.

Naturally we were elated at the success of the Henley representatives, Tony Page (3rd Junior Belt) and Murray Garretty (1st Senior Surf and 2nd Senior Belt), who were successful in gaining the first ever Australian Championship Medallions for South Australia. Hearty congratulations to you both.

The Junior R. and R. team also put up an excellent performance, but were very unfortunate in the draw for positions by having their best swimmers left on the beach to do line work.

Their drill was on a par with the other States, as the following figures show:

These figures reflect great credit on the lads and their instructor, Merv Butterfield.

The main lesson to be learned from our trip was, I feel (and this goes for all teams in South Australia), that a much greater effort is needed on the swimming side of their training if South Australian competitors are ever to win an Australian R. and R. title.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the lads for their co-operation on the trip, and I'm sure they all enjoyed themselves no end. I hope they drive into the lads who didn't go this time the necessity to hop in and raise the required finance, so that a large party can make the trip to Perth next March for the next Australian and State Championships.

Our thanks are extended to Ken Watson and Tom Meagher for all they do for us, Aub Laidlaw, Kevin Murray, and all at the Bondi Club, and Mr. Hilton and staff at the Bondi Pacific Hotel. A final word for "Pioneer" and their excellent drivers, too numerous to mention, who made our long journey so pleasant.
