## CAPTAIN'S REPORT

To mention one member who, though still a junior, won the Junior Surf Race Championship, competed in the Senior R. & R., in which he drew patient and won the swim, represented South Australia in the Australian Championships held in Queensland, and not forgetting to mention him winning the Junior Club Championships. (Well done, Rodney Payze. A fine effort).

On behalf of all other members, both past and present, I wish to congratulate all who gained honour in being State title holders, and those new members who gained various awards and club trophies during the season.

To our Senior R. & R., who again took the Ampol Shield for the sixth consecutive time, congratulations for a job well done. This feat would have been much harder if we did not have David Hemsley coaching us. To our boat crew members and Junior R. & R., a good try lads. A bit of bad luck, but with more hard training I think we will go places next year, even as far as Merriweather, Newcastle, N.S.W., for the Australian Championships to be held on March 12 and 13, 1960.

To all members who intend going to the Australian Championships, now is the time to do some thinking about it, not three weeks before it is time to go.

We have a golden opportunity before us, a chance to compete against the best competition in Australia. Various contributions are being made to our travelling fund and, with our members putting their shoulders to the wheel, our trip should prove a great success.

This year's competition has been extremely good and fought in the best manner. To our kindred clubs we say thanks, and we look forward to your keen competition next year.

To the management committee and to those Instructors who helped throughout the year in so many ways, I wish to express my gratitude and thanks. It has been a pleasure to work with you.

Our main source of income was derived from social activities conducted in the clubrooms under the able administration of Tom Jennings, whose untiring efforts should have been a splendid example to many club members. May I extend my personal thanks to you, Tom, and also to your assistant, Harold Pleass, for his good work.

In March a finance sub-committee was formed for the express purpose of raising money to complete the clubhouse internally and possibly sending the club to the Australian Championships in N.S.W. next year. However, the sub-committee's very keen and untiring efforts were not met with the anticipated enthusiasm of club members generally. After several meetings, and much "burning of the midnight oil", the sub-committee was forced to resign bodily just three months after it was formed.
