After winning these two events at the State Championships at Christies Beach, it was decided to send both teams to Merewether for the 1960 Australian Championships, and their performances were the best results ever by this Club, the Senior team finishing a very close second, and the Junior team a splendid third.

My congratulations are extended to A. Park, A. Page and T. Ewens on gaining selection in the State team that went to Merewether, a special mention for A. Park on his close second in the Australian Belt Championship.

During the past season the Awards taken have declined very sharply and an all out effort will have to be made next season to recruit more members, this will boost our points score for the "B.P." Boat Trophy.

In closing, I wish to thank Dave Hemsley, Merv Butterfield and Laurie Bailey for coaching the Rescue and Resuscitation teams, Clive Calnan, Peter Harris and Richard Robinson for Instructing the Bronze Classes.

## GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT

Gentlemen:

Your attention is directed to the fact that although our Club has excelled in Carnivals and other competitive events we cannot hope to achieve the ultimate and win the B.P. Surf Boat for our Club unless we also work more diligently toward the important goal of maintaining our gear and equipment in first class condition.

I think that you will agree that the task of a gear steward in maintaining equipment without the aid of a properly appointed assistant is an impossibility without the fullest co-operation of every member using that equipment. I should like to thank all members who were of assistance in my work as gear steward and particularly Max Griffiths for his help in the erection of the reel and ski racks and in passing I would like to commend to all members the thought that the 1960-61 gear inspection competition can be won by Henley S.L.S.C. if every member co-operates towards that goal by showing more care and appreciation of our gear and equipment.

Apart from the usual work of maintenance on expendable items of equipment, the following jobs were carried out this season:

1. BOAT SHED:
  - (a) New racks for Malaboo boards.
  - (b) Racks for 16'0"—skis moved from South to North wall.
  - (c) New racks for housing reels.
2. BOAT TRAILER:  
Burnt off and repainted.
3. SUN DECK DOOR:  
New lock fitted.
4. HALL DOOR:  
New lock fitted.
5. LOCKERS:  
New locks to patrol, gear stewards and Secretary's lockers.
6. BUOYS:  
All buoys repainted.

A recent survey of Items needing attention for the 1960-61 season resulted as follows:

1. EVE ROCKERS:  
Suggest replace steel tube rocker.
2. MARCH PAST COSTUMES:  
Moth eaten and faded—suggest new costumes.



3. LOCKERS:  
Always untidy—padlocks not fitted to many—suggest essential all members fit same as necessary.
4. LI LO ROLLERS:  
Three (3) needed to replace those lost over two seasons.
5. BELTS:  
Two (2) new safety belts to replace old type belts.
6. BEACH MARKER PEGS:  
Suggest new set owing to Aust. championships scheduled for S.A. next season.
7. BOATS:
  - (a) D. J. Newland No. 1—Clean off and re-varnish—replace existing quarter bar.
  - (b) A. W. Jolly No. 2—Clean off and repaint inside and out—also to rowing skulls.
8. FLOODLIGHT:  
Replace cracked 3-pin plug with rubber plug.
9. BOATSHED:  
New barrel bolt needed on door.
10. ROOF DECK:  
Seal up cracks in concrete roof over kitchen.

As may be seen from this report, there is much to be done in the interests of our Club if we are to achieve our goal of winning the gear inspection competition next season.

In conclusion, I extend best wishes to all members for a successful 1960-61 season.

The annual accounts which follow this report do not give rise to excited cries of delight so far as financial gains are concerned, but it is pleasing to report that the club's financial position is reasonably stable. The new season is just around the corner, and with the 1961 Australian Championships being held in our own State for the first time, all members will be striving to compete successfully and it is hoped that they will strive just as hard for their club's welfare by taking an active interest in its financial activities.
