Each season presents a challenge to the senior R. & R. with a forerunning reputation, of having each year for the past 10 years, won the Ampol Shield for consistency. However, I am sure David will agree with me that our most cherished ambition is to one day win the Australian Senior R. & R. Championship. The rest of the club members join me in saying thank you to the R. & R. team for their great teamwork and the very long hours of both drill and training required in this field of the Surf Association.

VICE-CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Rostered patrols were carried out during the season with the utmost efficiency and it is creditable to note that no swimming fatality occurred at our beach at a time when a rostered patrol was on duty.

There were several instances when, but for the altness of patrols, casualties would have undoubtedly occurred.

A total of 13 persons were rescued or assisted from difficulties. A feature of the season's rescues was the number of capsized yachts calling for assistance. Again stressing the value of the club surf boat for rescue work.

The total hours patrolled was 1,432, compared with 1,106 last season. The largest individual total was Peter Walls with 68½ hours. First-aid treatment 7.

In my opinion, patrols were carried out in a manner suitable for our particular beach maintaining vigilance and discipline at a reasonable level.

Next season we hope to install toilets, hot showers and a new dressing room floor. It is to be hoped that members will respect these amenities. A ceiling and a good coat of paint should improve our recreation hall. The cool drink machine has run at a very slight profit, but bottles left on the beach and in the boat shed were not returned, and this kept the profits down.

The Saint John Ambulance Brigade used our hall for a Cabaret this season and Bill Renfrey and Doug Openshaw continue to conduct successful swimming classes during the winter. The Catholic Tennis Association held a social and we have also had a wedding reception and numerous "Buck's" nights for members and their friends. A band was using the hall for practice for a short time and the club ran a weekly film evening for members, but poor attendances due mainly to TV caused these to run at a loss and was abandoned.

The Seagull Youth Club used our hall for a weekly meeting place for its members earlier in the year, but these have since been discontinued. The Club's Presentation Night, held early this season, attracted a big crowd and a good time was had by all.

Next season we hope to make full use of our hall and with the alterations coming up soon we hope to have a complete and fully operational Clubhouse from which to compete next season as the top Club in South Australia.
