It is with deep regret that we report the passing of one of our younger members, Errol Noack. Errol, who was killed in action in Vietnam whilst serving his country, will be missed by all members who knew him and to his parents and relatives we extend our sincere sympathies.

TREASURER'S REPORT

During the season there were several noteworthy features regarding club finance. The most notable of these was the very generous bequest of \$1,000 left to the Club in the Will of our late Patron, Mr. A. W. Jolly. The bequest is an endorsement of the great regard that Mr. Jolly had for our Club and of course our gratitude can never be adequately expressed. Of the sum received \$400 were appropriated towards the cost of the "A. W. JOLLY III" Surf Boat and the remaining \$600 have been placed in a

special building fund for clubhouse improvements. The choice of name for our new surf boat was unanimous and needed no second thought as it created another opportunity for us to perpetuate the name of our late Patron as further acknowledgment of his great support.

The new surf boat was launched on December 17th, 1965, at Henley, and our Patron's wife, Mrs. Norm Tucker, performed the christening ceremony. The Rev. M. C. W. Gooden blessed the boat and it was gratifying to have Mrs. Jolly and family present in the very good attendance of Club officials and supporters.

Donations this year were the highest for many seasons due mainly to our surf boat appeal and although these particular donations were acknowledged in the local press we take this opportunity of again thanking the donors for their support. A special word of thanks is due to our Patron, Vice-Patrons, President and Vice-Presidents; your continued support is very much appreciated by all members.

As can be seen from the financial statement, social activities also provided a large boost to Club funds. In this regard our members take full credit for their untiring efforts, especially in connection with the auction conducted last October. The net result of this auction was just under \$600 and special thanks are due to Mr. Bill Hann, Senior, for use of his premises and to Mr. Bill Hann, Junior, who fostered the idea and provided his auctioneering services free of charge.

Maintenance costs this year were higher, with the bulk of the expense being confined to repairing the old surf boat, refitting and painting clubhouse windows and replacing damaged floor boards in the hall. As already stated we have established a Building Fund for Clubhouse improvements and we are hopeful of increasing the \$600 in this fund to \$1,000 which, together with Council and/or Government subsidy, will enable us to install toilet and improved shower facilities.

On behalf of the Management Committee I must thank all members for your support in our various fund-raising ventures and to fellow committee members, my personal thanks for your assistance during the year.

ADDENDUM

Gentlemen, having just concluded a very successful season wherein once again your Club has been to the fore in the State Centre Activities, I would like to pay a tribute to all the members who trained so actively in the various fields of competition. To our Secretary and Treasurer our Club is indebted for their sterling efforts this season as these two men formed the nucleus of our successful fund-raising efforts, which resulted in the acquisition of the new surf boat, and which the residents of Henley Beach can be individually and truly proud of as a community effort. On behalf of the Club I wish to take this opportunity to thank our supporters in this wonderful effort.

Perhaps the most outstanding incident in the competitive side would be the sportsmanship of Geoff Duhne who took the place of Alan Nelson in our Senior R. & R. team for the State Titles and when presented with the winning gold medal immediately handed it to me stating, "This belongs to Alan", as Alan had several days prior to the Titles damaged his hand in an accident but had competed in the team throughout the whole season. This was an exceptional gesture on Geoff's part and it was truly appreciated by Alan and the rest of the team who wished me to thank him on their behalf.

I am sure you all look forward to a much closer-knit team next year so that we will be able to compete in strength at the forthcoming 1967 Australian Surf Championships.

I would like to thank the officers and the Club members for their co-operation throughout the season.
