#### THE MAJOR OBJECTS OF THE CLUB ARE:

1. To study and practice the methods of Surf Life Saving. as laid down by the S.L.S.A. of Australia Handbook.
2. To minimise the loss of life from drowning by proficient life-saving apparatus conforming with S.L.S.A. of Australia Standards.
3. To Promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction so as to bring about a widespread and thorough knowledge of the principles of the art of natation, and general further the best interests of surf bathing.
4. To appoint patrols to render all possible aid to those in distress.



## PRESIDENT 'S REPORT.

The 1977-78 season has been one of varied success for the Henley Club. On the debit side we gained few new members and since we were without a Chief Instructor for most of the summer, training of new members was difficult to co-ordinate.

As the season went on, more committee members were lost making the general running of the club extremely difficult. We were sad to lose the valuable services and keen dedication of Philip Carter, but we wish him every success with his new club Aldinga Bay.

The Club is also in an uncertain position regarding its accomodation. There have been complaints from the Henley & Grange Council concerning our equipment being left out on the promenade, though in the past we were denied permission to build extra storage space. We do however have the opportunity of building new premises as part of the Henley Square development. The committee are looking hard at this and firm proposals have yet to be made.

On the credit side the club did have a good competitive season winning several events at the State Championships. Moves are afoot to improve on these successes and consolidate the ranks of the members. It is encouraging to see winter training being undertaken to improve the abilities of the younger members. In the past not enough has been done to bring upcoming Nippers into senior competition and therefore senior club activities in general.

Young blood is needed to strengthen both the administrative as well as the competitive field for the future advancement of the Club, otherwise the club will go stale and slide backwards. The older members have been relied on for too long. They have had their day, they know it and they feel it. I would therefore expect to see, for next year a management committee comprised of only enough experienced members as is necessary to provide background information and know how to the remainder who should be genuine active members who are at the club two or three times a week, with their fingers right on the pulse and with their club-mates right behind them.

It has been demonstrated this last year that this club can do well in certain separate areas of competition. Now the club must succeed as an integrated body so that members can derive genuine satisfaction from taking part in club activities. We have to make being a lifesaver what it was in the beginning, a challenge, an achievement and distinction.

I have much faith in the Henley Club. It is a fine club with a great heritage. It would be tragic to let that which was built up by the 'Old Timers' be eroded away by the sands of time and apathy. A club cannot survive on its reputation and so I hope and trust therefore that such moves toward rejuvenation will build the strong foundation for the future that Henley needs.

I would like to make note of the fine work done by David Tout in these past ten months as club secretary. Dave took on a very demanding job particularly when he had been a member for a relatively short period and not knowing a great deal of the club's background. In June this year he was transferred in his employment to Bell Bay in Tasmania and we wish him all the best.

The year 1977/78 was one of mixed fortunes for our club. Carnival Results were pleasing, spirit was a little low, fund raising fair and good results in one area does not make up for a poor result in another, so each and every aspect of the club must be looked into if things are to improve.

Surley one of the most pleasing results of the season was our Third place in the Bank of New South Wales patrol efficiency competition, for which we won a malibu rescue board. Outside carnival competition it is this event that is most sought after, it shows which clubs are more proficient at the most important part of Lifesaving. In 1976/77 we came eighth in this event, this year third, a jump of five placings two more and we will have this coveted shield sitting on our wall. A little more effort from all members could achieve this.

The number of awards gained by members this season must have been the lowest for several years. There were 12 qualifying certificates gained. Four Bronze Medallions, two Instructors Certificates and one Examiners Certificate. If these figures are not drastically increased in the next year or so the club's future is in jeopardy. It is a hard enough job to get people to join the club but it is just as hard to find members who are willing to train them, it is always left up to the same two or three people to train a squad, and sooner or later these two or three will be fed up, so someone else will have to be found. I hope members will realise the situation and do what they can to help.

Patrols were quite well run this season, with the usual few who arrived late or "forgot they are on". I suppose there will always be those few who break the rules, unless we are taken over by computers or something. We are always trying to come up with ideas to make patrols more attractive for members. A motorised tricycle did the trick a couple of years ago but unfortunately it could not withstand exposure to the salt and moisture and became ruined beyond repair. Perhaps when we have adequate storing facilities we could look at a 4 wheel-drive vehicle or a Rubber Duckie.

The format of the Wales inspections were that situations were simulated and the patrol must do everything they would do in a real life rescue, heart attack, shark attack or whatever. As I mentioned earlier in this report, Henley finished third in this event in front of fifteen other clubs, and that is not a bad effort at all, and every member concerned should be congratulated.

During the season our patrols returned several lost children to their parents, rescued one small boy who got into difficulties in stormy seas, and treated numerous first aid cases ranging from marine stings through to a split head. Individual patrol hours were once again topped by Rodney Hill, with a total of 132½ hours, followed by Graham Hill with 112½ hours and third with 84 was Scott Ryan, Scott being the junior to accumulate the most hours for the season. Darryl White was the cadet to do the most with 54. Henley Beach foreshore was patrolled for a total of 1713½ hours by the Henley S.L.S.C. between 1-11-77 27-3-78. This was 230½ hours less than the previous years total of 1944 hours.

With the approach of yet another season I ask every member to stop for a few minutes to think and ask himself "Am I putting back into the club what the club has given me?" "What can I do to ensure the healthy growth of My Club?" Let's see what you can do by passing your ideas on to the committee.

I take this opportunity to welcome all new members and congratulate those who gained awards in this 1977/78 season.

## JUNIOR DIVISION HENLEY NIPPER REPORT 1977/78.

This season, 7 and 8 year olds were re-introduced, as it was realised over the past 2 seasons that this was the age groups where the new parents came from who could become involved with training and committee work.

Consequently, 1200 newsletters were sent to the 6 local primary schools as a recruiting drive. Unfortunately we only recruited 20 new boys. Our total registrations for the year were 53 and by the end of the season we had 43 remaining.

This season, the parents were told that attendance at the carnivals for their boys was compulsory and it was very pleasing to report that at all carnivals we had an average attendance of 40. Thank you parents!

Three Henley boys were chosen in the State Team which competed in the Australian Titles at Eleoura Beach, N.S.W. in January. Congratulations to Tony Ryan, Darryl White, and Paul Oaten.

In the State Titles at Port Elliott, Henley finished in 7th position out of 15 competing clubs which was an excellent effort considering the small number of competitors we had.

Now to the bad news. The juniors were introduced so that the Seniors could get a flow on into their ranks when boys turned 13. But year after year, and this year was the most blatant, these boys on becoming cadets are completely ignored by senior members.

From 7 to 13, these boys have been accustomed to weekly organized training in all carnival events, but when they become cadets they come on Sunday mornings to find that there is no training session in any event what so ever. Consequently, 90% of the boys lose interest and disappear from the club and over the years this has included many State Nipper reps. who could have gained many points at Senior Carnivals if they had been encouraged.

As Chief Instructor of the Juniors I am disgusted with all seniors for their lack of interest in the boys. I have given up 7 years of my summer weekends to train these boys only to see them disillusioned and bitterly disappointed when they move into the Senior ranks.

Unless the situation improves in the near future it is quite probable that those few of us who run the Juniors will see fit to disband the division rather than see the boys and their parents disappointed.

So how about it chaps. Pull your finger out this coming season and help get training squads organized and make this a strong club once again.
