THE MAJOR OBJECTS OF THE CLUB ARE:

1. To study and practice the methods of Surf Life Saving as laid down by the S.L.S.A. of Australia Handbook.
2. To minimise the loss of life from drowning by proficient life-saving apparatus conforming with the S.L.S.A. of Australia Standards.
3. To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction so as to bring about a widespread and thorough knowledge of the principles of the art of natation, and general further the best interests of surf bathing.
4. To appoint patrols to render all possible aid to those in distress.

THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT
