## THE PRESIDENT'S FOREWORD

Your Management Committee has spent the past winter months analyzing these areas, and have formulated programmes to be implemented prior to the commencement of the 1983/84 Season.

Under discussion is recruiting, patrols, discipline, clubhouse tidyness and further renovations and the budgeting for new equipment on a continuous basis so that all sections of the club can benefit.

Some decisions may not be popular to all, but members must realize that there is more to Surf Life Saving than an occasional patrol in payment for successes in competition.

The Committee has already allocated funds for next season so that all areas are assisted, and the appropriate officers can now begin to meet the challenges which lay ahead.

The business which comes before a Surf Life Saving Club seems to increase each year and this past year has probably been the busiest for many seasons. Throughout the year much debate took place on a variety of subjects and it was good to see that while Committee Members' points of view often differed, they always sought what was best for your club.

To them all, I express my appreciation.

## BOAT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The season started with the best winter build up for a decade but due to the loss of some key rowers at critical times and a very short season we were continually under pressure and the unsettled crews and a lack of rowers with a few years experience behind them told on us at the State Titles, which were held on the 13th Feb. in flat conditions at Southport.

With 11 members doing winter weight training and the same A crew as last year the season looked promising and the A crew were a close second at the first carnival. But from then on problems occurred. Alan Nelson who had stroked the A crew for the past 7 seasons was transferred to Alice Springs. The promising but inexperienced B crew lost their stroke with John Kildea coming down with the mumps. These events started the unsettling of all crews which with further problems during the short season we never overcame.

At the State Titles the hard work put in by all was apparent with all crews making the finals. The A crew were running with the leaders and third at the cans but due to the controversial adjustment and misalignment at the cans we were eliminated.
