### PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1983/84.

Following the last A.G.M. I spoke to the members of the Beach Committee and outlined what was expected of them in the positions that each had just been elected to. I pointed out that no matter how well they did their jobs it would in the main, go unthanked and probably unnoticed by a large section of the club, and that the rewards for having done the job well will come from within, knowing that they had contributed to the future of the Henley Surf Life Saving Club. Similarly, I pointed out that the officer who failed in his position would undoubtedly receive criticism from his fellow members.

While I believe these statements to be correct, they are quite unfair considering that the officer of today has an enormous work load which has to be done on a voluntary basis.

The role of the volunteer lifesaver has over the past 10 years become more demanding and on present indications that trend will continue for years to come. This places most Livesaving Clubs in a difficult position as to how to meet the challenges and reach the goals which lie ahead.

The Henley Club, being the first Lifesaving Club in S.A., and being instrumental in the formation of the Lifesaving movement in this State as well as its unbeaten history of competitive successes is reason for all members to hold their heads high.

It is, however to the future that we must always concern ourselves, and to the achievements which can only be reached by members working towards a common goal. Whether strong administration or strong competitive skills leads to a stronger club, would give cause for an endless debate. It is true, however, that a healthy blend of these two objectives is an important ingredient in making Henley a stronger club in S.A.

All members should be prepared to seek office on their Club's committee, and it is their duty to ensure that the best person is elected to each position (not necessarily the most popular, nor the most experienced). Members should also realise that the committees cannot solve all of the problems in a lifesaving club, nor can they make decisions or policies that are popular to all. Most officers are doing their jobs because others were not prepared to do it, or because they believe that they can contribute to the future development of their club. Your club will succeed in the future only if all members share this responsibility of developing the future.

This may mean becoming an officer, doing your patrols more enthusiastically, training harder, becoming a leader instead of a follower, respecting the clubrooms and club gear, or by simply not criticizing, but instead understanding and supporting the decisions made in the interests of the Henley Surf Lifesaving Club.

Several senior officers have indicated that they will not be seeking re-election next season, and so the opportunity is now there for all members to visualise how they would like to see the Club in two or three years time, and for them to put up their hands, stand for office and make that picture a reality.

### HONORARY SECRETARY'S REPORT

Our older members remember Tommy well as he was a keen member until an unfortunate car accident ended his sporting career - but Tommy maintained his interest in our Club over many years.

Our thanks also go to our other donors which include Major and Mrs. Rogers and the Ramsgate Hotel; "Super" Sid Goodfellow, whose super efforts on behalf of our Club are very much appreciated; Mal Fuss for donating a set of surf boat oars; Jim Mackay for equipping the sun deck which has been named after him; Peter Mackay for his help in equipping the gymnasium; Posum Baker for his continued financial help (a modern day Tommy Barnes); Amy Forwood, and many others.

Our Club has had some trials and tribulations this year, but I feel that we have the members, the building, the background, the equipment and the finances to again become the strongest Club along the coast. All we need is strong leadership and solid, constructive support from all members.

### BOAT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Training started for most of the crews around June last year with weight training, running and the occasional row on Sundays.

We were well represented in all senior divisions in the beginning of the season with crews gaining many places.

The need for a new boat became obvious when, despite repairs in the winter, the United Motors started coming apart around us after a day in the surf. The Committee agreed and a new blue-hulled, fibre-glass, foam sandwich Ninham was ordered. Funds were raised to help towards the cost of the boat from selling cray raffles and bottle drives and thanks to all that helped.

A. Madsen, R. Jennings and myself travelled to Sydney to pick up the boat just before Christmas and we made a detour to carnivals at 13th Beach and Bancoora in Victoria where the A crew rowed well and gained some valuable experience from some of the top Victorian coaches.

The boat was later christened the "Jim Doherty" in honour of his long association and interest in Henley boat crews.

The two Goolwa carnivals were probably the highlight of the season. In swells of six to eight feet, Henley showed it has some of the best surf crews in the State. This was from regular training in surf which is a must.

At the State Titles, all crews were in the finals, except the C2's who only just missed out, and considering they were only a very new young crew, it was a good effort. In the open final, Henley were equal second to the cans in very choppy conditions. When we reached the beach, we found that we had missed a bronze by a quarter of a boat length. We were by no means disgraced as the whole crew had given their all, which is what counts in my book. The B's were looking good in the heats and semi's. But I think the choppy windy conditions must have unsettled them, and they finished fourth. The C crew looked like favourites for the final after winning both heat and semifinal. But again the very windy and choppy conditions in the afternoon were against us and we had to settle for 3rd.

Both the A and B crews represented the Club at the Australians at Kurruwa, Queensland. Although we didn't do as well as we would have liked to have done, a lot of experience and knowledge was gained.

On completing my report, I would like to thank all for their support and their efforts through the season. The A and B crews look to stay together this coming season which is essential for success. So you should see Henley back on top in the not too distant future.

### C.D. "CHOOK" FIELDER, O.A.M.

One of our life members, Charles "Chook" Fielder, was honoured on the Queen's Birthday by being awarded the Order of Australia Medal for service to the sport of Surf Life Saving.

Chook joined our Club in the season of 1938/39 and won the Henley to Grange swim and was the State Champion in the 440 yard freestyle in the same season.

He was instrumental in getting Henley members examined for their bronze medallion at Chiton and the subsequent affiliation of Henley to the Surf Life Saving Association in Sydney. Henley members then started the Moana Club and joined Glenelg so that a South Australian branch could be formed and competitions held. Later, Seacliff also joined.

During the early fifties, Chook administered the running of Swing Band shows in the old Tivoli Theatre in Grote Street. These were held every couple of months and were so successful that entrepreneurs eventually squeezed us out. But over £3,000 had been raised which enabled the erection of our existing club rooms to be started.

Chook was made a life member in 1954 and a life member of State Centre in 1964.

We congratulate him on this honour and wish him and his wife, Beverley, well for the future.
