I am pleased to report on the Club's progress in this our 60th year. Our Club has achieved much in its time but we are still a young club with many areas open to further development. Sixteen people gained their bronze medal - six more than last year. Also five instructors and eight cadets qualified. The 60th Anniversary Dinner Ball at Football Park was well attended by past and present members, and gave our younger members an insight into the fine tradition and history of our Club (if only we could find someone to record and write our Club history!). To John Goldsworthy, Sue Williams and Michelle Richardson, many thanks for organising and conducting the dinner.

I thank Paul Fitzgerald for assisting me during the season. Although Paul worked quietly and out of sight his efforts greatly helped your Committee.

Committee meetings were well attended and in particular our Treasurer's efficiency must be mentioned. His financial reports containing the vital information enabling your committee to make the right decisions were always on time and informative.

Our clubrooms still require a lot of work to be done to improve and maintain their condition, and coupled with our loan repayments, have become the largest single drain on our finances. The future committee will have to apply itself to this and try to reduce some principal from our loan.

The Junior division of our Club is not progressing as we would like, attendances and numbers have decreased; and with eight of them progressing to cadets, some parents will not now be assisting with training. This will require new recruits and a new junior committee. Rodney Hill has indicated he will be prepared to coach and assist the committee so it is up to parents and nippers to enrol new members and become involved.

One was Tony van Ruiten who helped out last season by instructing squads, but who could not gain his Instructor's Certificate through no fault of his own. Happily this year Tony put through a Bronze squad of very high standard and gained his Instructor's Certificate. Congratulations Tony, and thank you for your patience with the system.

Scott Bradley was one person who was not going to be held back. In one season Scott gained his Instructor's Certificate, Advance Resus. Instructor's Certificate, Advance Resus Certificate, Radio Certificate, and is a probationary member of the Board of Examiners. He was also appointed Field Officer for South Australia, an appointment both Henley and Scott can be proud of.

Others to get their Instructor's were Gary Davis, Petra Wiesner and Andrew Lanyon who put through a female squad. Barry Duhne already has his Instructor's from a long time back, but is always ready to help out with instructing. This season Barry put through 8 members for their Surf Life Saving Certificate. It is a pity that far too many members take only one Bronze squad and stop at that. It would help the Club out tremendously if all members who have their Instructor's would take one more squad instead of leaving it up to the same old few.

To all the Instructor's this season, my sincere thanks for a job well done, for without your help my work would have been a very difficult one.

Also this season, the Club had 7 members receive their Advanced Resuscitation Certificate which of me is the next natural progression in Surf Life Saving. This Certificate is the refinement in resuscitation and saving lives which is what surf life saving is about. Once again too many members stop once they have got their Bronze medallions.

Barry Duhne put through a large number of people for their Radio Certificate and it was good to see such a large response to this award: the silly thing is that when it came to using their newly acquired skill on patrol, etc., I found a very large number of these people didn't want to talk on the radio for fear of embarrassment. If only they would realise the help this relatively simple award has in improving the service we provide to the bathing public, not to mention the time and effort your instructor and yourselves put into achieving this award. If you have a skill please use it to the best of your ability for every little bit helps.

Well, that is what happened in the 84/85 season and now on to the 85/86 season with, I hope, a lot more new members for the Henley Club and a lot of the present members gaining new awards.

BOAT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The year's training began in June with weights, running and weather permitting, rowing. By the first carnival four crews were fit and ready for competition.

Throughout the season, the A crew competed strongly, gaining third in the Open Boat Shield. The B crew also rowed very competitively gaining 3rd place in the Reserve Grade Shield.

In the C division, our crew was the one to beat and won all but two of the carnivals. This performance ensured the C division Boat Shield for the Club. The second C crew, the "C2's" put up a good performance considering they all lacked experience. They were placed 2nd at the Middleton carnival and made the final at the States.

As the season progressed we were able to form a second B crew who showed they will be a force with more experience. A scratch Veteran crew rowed at most carnivals but the flesh was weak and rowing against younger crews proved unsuccessful.

During the season, the B crew ran two \$1,000 raffle draws and raised enough money to buy a full set of desperately needed oars. Two working bees were organised during the season to rub down and varnish the oars and boats, and the attendance of crews was appreciated. It is this type of team spirit and hard work that keeps our boats in such good condition.

The old trailer received a new lease of life, thanks to the efforts of B. Godfrey and B. Cole. Unfortunately, the Jim Doherty was holed and some oars broken as a result of a collision with Seacliff at the Middleton Carnival but was ready for the next carnival, thanks to Max Fry of Adelaide Dinghy Centre.

At the State Titles, 6 senior Henley crews competed with the A crew turning the cans 2nd (only 1½ boat lengths behind the leader) but were pipped on the line for 2nd and had to settle for a Bronze medal. The Reserve crew also turned 2nd but although they tried their hardest, missed out on a medal and finished fourth. Our "Super C's" didn't let us down and won Gold in a close finish. Well done, boys. The "C2's" rowed well to make the final but could only manage . The "B2's" just missed out on the final after turning on a valiant effort.

Three crews represented the Club at the Australian Titles at Point Leo. The odds seemed against the A crew from the start. We drew the hottest heat of round one and with the weather conditions found ourselves out of the carnival. The Reserves made it to the second round before suffering a similar fate. Hopefully, we all learned a few lessons over there and can put them into practice this coming season.

Finally, I would like to thank all who rowed and helped in the boat area and let's make next season one to remember.

TREASURER'S REPORT

A review of the Financial Statements for Season 1984/85 will show a reduction in funds held by the Club from \$20,300 to \$14,300 and a reduction in net income derived for the period from \$7,500 in Season 1983/84 to \$830 in Season 1984/85.

The Club has incurred capital expenditure on the building being renovations, purchase and laying of carpet and painting to the hall of \$5,100 and with the conclusion of the proposed working bees, it is hoped that the hall will become a source of revenue making for the Club.

Other purchase of capital, the main item being the Inflatable Rubber Boat, was purchased with the support of donations to the Club.

The reduction in net income can be seen by comparison of the various trading accounts, and a reduction in income received combined with increased costs associated with the training, commitment and running of the Club.

During the season the account associated with the Sub-Junior division of the Club was closed and the financial running of this division was administered by the Hon. Treasurer through the General Account.

The \$1500 Investment previously held by the Sub-Junior division was cashed-in and the funds were placed towards the purchase of a cash register for the Top Room.

At the conclusion of the year, a transfer of \$2200 was made from excess funds held in the Social Club Account for use in the General Account.

Some loss in the Clothing Account can be attributed to the purchase of jackets for the Australian Title Touring Team but the sale of clothing items still remains an area for tighter control and administration.

VALE - SIR ADRIAN CURLEWIS, C.V.O., C.B.E.

On behalf of Mr. Alan B. Whelpton, A.M., President of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia, it is my sad duty to inform you of the passing of our Life Governor, His Honour, Sir Adrian Curlewis, C.V.O., C.B.E.

In recognition of his long and distinguished service to the Association and the Australian public, he was made a Knight Commander Order of the British Empire. On February 28th, 1974, in a personal private audience with Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Sir Adrian was presented with the Commander of the Royal Victorian Order.

During his 42 year term as President, membership of the Surf Life Saving Association grew from 6,398 to 29,875, the number of clubs increased from 110 to 230, and 185,104 lives were saved.

Upon retirement as President in 1975, Sir Adrian was fittingly elevated to the special position of Life Governor.

Sir Adrian, the Association President from 1933 to 1975, passed away on Sunday, 16th June at his Mosman home after a short illness. He was aged 84.

No person could have done more to promote the good name of the Surf Life Saving Association than Sir Adrian, affectionately known as 'The Judge'. For 62 years this man, one of Nature's gentlemen, was part of the movement, spreading the message of surf life saving throughout Australia and the world.
