TREASURER'S REPORT

The attached Balance Sheet and supporting statements detailed the transactions and resultant balance of funds for the club as at the 31st of May 1987.

Whilst the financial position of the club is now extremely stable this is mainly due to the interim distribution to 1/20th share of the residual value to the Estate of the late Miss Amy Ritchie Forwood.

The club is extremely fortunate to have had such a generous and marvelous benefactor and we are most appreciative.

The resultant distribution of funds are :

- 1/ Funds received from the Estate of Amy Forwood at present being held in investment \$65,000.00
- 2/ Social Club Funds \$500.00
- 3/ Provision for new oars and double ski from sponsorship received \$2,200.00
- 4/ Funds available for general use \$12,908.00

From the funds in the General Account it is anticipated that we will be able to repay our debenture held with the City of Henley and Grange in June this year, leaving only one outstanding loan of \$23,000.00 with the Surf Lifesaving Association of Australia, South Australian State Centre, Trust Account. To repay the loan our General Account will be reduced to a minimal balance and it is hoped members will continue and increase our fundraising efforts to meet our costs of operation for the coming season.

Our excess of Income over Expenditure for the season was mainly due to fundraising efforts of members. The Top Room and Top Room Manager are in need of greater support both in trade and operational assistance to enable the Top Room to operate as a viable activity. The sale of clothing continues to be of concern with the account again showing a loss on trading.

My appreciation is extended to all members who assisted in fundraising activities, to the committee for their support and the auditors for their duties performed. Members of the public who donated not only funds but in goods and service are greatly acknowledged, for, again without those donations we would not be able to maintain our operation.

Whilst the club will continue to require fundraising and financial support it is hoped that the funds received from the Amy Forwood Estate will assist and enable the club to grow from strength to strength.
