PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Our Club has had another successful season with 9 new Bronzes, 9 Surf Life Saving Certificates and a growth in membership which together with the purchase of several items of equipment will help us to continue on our path to regaining the overall strength that we had in the early 60's and 70's.

Again we saw some outstanding efforts by members including John "Tulip" Beugelaar in the Top Room, Paul "Digger" Martin who has now won the most patrol hours in the State for the second year running, Geoff Brennecke first aid, Rose Nelson publicity and history records, and Shelly Nelson instructing cadets.

Others who chipped in were Andrew Hatwell, Matt and Paul Newman, Alan Battersby, Kathy Tucker, Grantley White, Doug Campbell and Philip Hogan.

We purchased a new surf boat with a sponsorship deal over two years from the Ramsgate Hotel that will cover two thirds of its cost. Without this sort of support and with surf boats costing \$12,000 they would become very hard to purchase solely from Club funds.

The boat was named "THE TONY PARK" in honour of possibly the greatest competitor this Club and even South Australian Life Saving has had. Tony joined in the 1952/53 season and has competed with success in all areas of Life Saving including being selected in an Australian Team to New Zealand in 1960.

Other purchases were a new ski, IRB motor, base radio, air conditioning for the Top Room and a personal computer. This last item when it is fully set up will enable us to communicate in writing to members very effectively and maintain our records efficiently.

We again thank our Sponsors who have supported us for many years now and I urge you to peruse their list detailed in this Report and use their products or services in preference to others.

The State Government through State Centre has granted each Club \$12,000 over the next three years to improve Surf Life Saving facilities at club level and this money is much appreciated.

My thanks to your Committee who have toiled long and hard in your interests and worked in a harmonious manner to ensure the smooth running of the Club and its future.

We are at an important stage of our future with a growing membership and a fairly sound financial base and it is vital that only persons committed to continue the hard work of previous committees stand for election today.

Finally, I would urge everyone to use the Top Room as it is now our biggest money earner and with its new air conditioner more comfortable than ever.

There was also an increase in patrolling hours with patrols continuing to 7-00pm on hot days. This proved quite effective with a 75% of incidents happening between 5-00pm to 7-00pm.

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POWER BOAT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 1989/90 season was very successful in all areas of the IRB, ranging from minimal major rescue work to very strong on the competitive side.

This season saw a strong interest towards the IRB from a large amount of members who all helped to keep it on Patrols and train new bronze members. We also gained two new drivers with three currently training.

The patrol season was successful with only minor rescues, like missing person searches (all found unharmed), warnings to jet skis endangering the public, assisting wind surfers into shallow water and on five occasions chased sharks back out to sea.

The reliability of the boat was increased due to purchasing a new motor replacing the original one. Throughout the season many people assisted me with help and some good advice, many thanks to Paul Martin, Jason Lewis, Jim Goldsmith, Geoff Brennecke, Paul Frost and Michael Lewis of Lewis Brothers Marine.

Once again Cole Motors has supplied us with our fuel throughout the year, their donation is greatly appreciated and I hope our members can spread the word and help send business towards Cole Motors.

In January the crew competed in the two day carnival at Warnambool and performed well without gaining any places.

Our new boat "The Tony Park" was launched on Saturday, 10 February 1990 and has proven to be a classy boat with good all round characteristics. It runs well on skates, lifts its nose going out through the break and runs well in flat conditions. If the boat performs as well as its namesake it will notch up many winning performances.

Three weeks before the State Champs the A Crew lost Steve Crouch who damaged his coccyx at a Goolwa Carnival and Darren Hocking who was called back from Ceduna filled in for a few training sessions and had to return to Ceduna but promised to try and come back for the States and Aussies. He was able to get time off and after not rowing for twelve months filled in for a gutsy effort with the A's coming second in the States. Due to the close finish we can only wonder how they would have gone without all their problems during the season.

The B Crew had teething problems early and then lost Jamie Butterfield half way through the season and with the return of Andrew Madsen from 18 months overseas were under pressure to come together all season but showed form which eluded them at the States.

There were alot of happy Crews State Titles night and also some very disappointed ones who put in a large effort over the season only to have an off day at the States (one Barrie Cole was heard to say he gained a place every carnival this season only to come 4th for the fourth year at the States). Whereas the thrown together B Crew with much experience but no training won the State title.

Other crews who trained all season showed that lack of co-ordinated training especially near the end of the season shows under pressure.

The A and B Crews competed at the Australian Champs in North Woolongong but were put out in the second round. They both performed well with the A's crossing the line in heavy seas with 4 other boats, but being placed 4th were eliminated, a credible row given their injury problems.

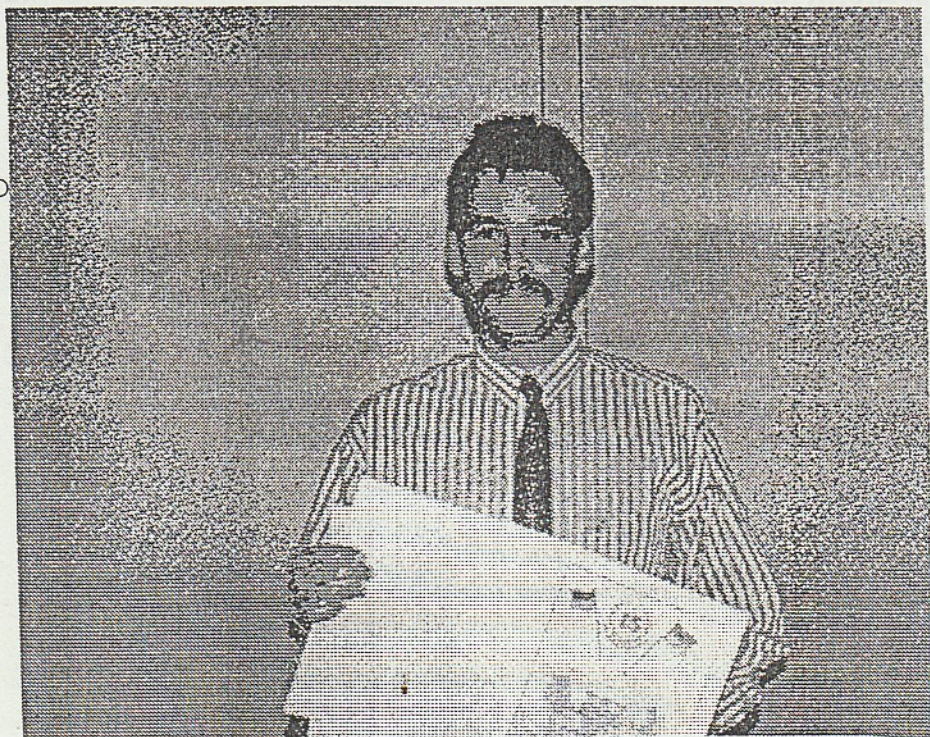
Training has commenced for next year and we are always looking for new recruits. With more competitors we can compete in more team events and in return gain more points for the Club.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

EXPLANATION OF STATEMENTS:

My Treasurer's Report contains three statements, a statement of Receipts and Payments, a Profit and Loss statement and a Balance Sheet. The statement of Receipts and Payments is a summary of all receipts issued and cheques written throughout the financial year to explain the current balances in the club's various accounts. The Profit and Loss statement records the club's performance as a trading entity and has been segmented to highlight the results of particular areas of the Club's activities. The Balance Sheet records the club's Assets and Liabilities indicating the Club's financial standing at 31st May 1990.

1989/90 FINANCIAL YEAR:

Examination of the Profit and Loss reveals a large decrease in the surplus generated, this should be seen however in the light of a number of extenuating circumstances.

1. The amount paid to utilities (i.e. ETSA, SAGASCO, TELECOM) is much higher than last year due to differences in the timing of payments to these bodies, basically saying that last year's figures were understated.
2. Since much of the funds received for the Hepatitis B Program were received in the 1988/90 season but the expenditure was in the 1989/90 season, the loss represented here is really overstated.

- Important features of this year's Statements -

1. Bar profits were up slightly but on greatly increased trading which represents a decrease in bar profitability. After discussions with the Top Room Manager, I have come to the conclusion that this is a result of increases in liquor prices not being passed on to customers of the Top room. It is up to the incoming committee to formulate the policy in this direction. The Top Room Manager, Damien Slaven, is to be congratulated on his running of the Top Room this season, maintaining it as the club's major source of income.
2. Income from social functions was well down last season with the Social Committee's stated aim of having fewer but more profitable shows not really succeeding.
3. Income from subscriptions was well down on last season reflecting a drop in membership, large increases in subs have not, however, been recommended.
4. Depreciation charged this season is much higher reflecting the large number of capital acquisitions.

SUMMARY

The 1989/90 season has seen Henley consolidate its strong financial position while also reaping the rewards through the acquisition of a number of key capital items, which are listed below. The Committee did not spend over \$22,000 on these items lightly and did so after much discussion and reasoned argument. Some more such expenditure is budgeted for this season (e.g. on a new I.R.B.) but the 1989/90 season will probably be seen as a high point for these types of capital purchases.

The club once again demonstrated its ability to generate surpluses and has a strong financial base to work from. I would like to thank Trevor Mulvihill, Damien Slaven, Barrie Cole and Sally Trodd for their assistance this season.
