

THE MAJOR OBJECTS OF THE CLUB ARE:

- 1. To study and practise the methods of Surf Life Saving as laid down by The S.L.S.A. of Australia Handbook.
- 2. To minimise the loss of life from drowning by proficient life-saving apparatus conforming with S.L.S.A. of Australia standards.
- 3. To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction so as to bring about a widespread and thorough knowledge of the principles of the art of natation, and generally further the best interests of surf bathing.
- 4. To appoint patrols to render all possible aid to those in distress.

I MUST THANK MARK SEARCY FOR A JOB WELL DONE AS TEAM MANAGER TO SCARBOROUGH FOR THE AUSTRALIAN TITLES. ANYONE WHO HAS PERFORMED THIS DUTY WILL KNOW IT IS NOT AN EASY TASK.

CONGRATULATIONS TO DEAN BEAUMONT FOR WINNING A BRONZE MEDALLION AT THE AUSTRALIAN TITLES IN OPEN SKI. IT DEFINITELY IS ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS.

PATROLS SEEM TO HAVE BEEN PERFORMED PROFESSIONALLY. THERE WAS A PROBLEM WITH MANY MEMBERS FAILING TO REPORT FOR PATROL DUTIES, GIVING THE OFFICERS OF THE CLUB MANY HEADACHES. IT IS ONE PROBLEM WHICH WILL HAVE TO BE ADDRESSED NEXT YEAR.

ON A PERSONAL LEVEL I HAVE VERY MUCH ENJOYED THE EXPERIENCE OF CAPTAINING THE CLUB, DESPITE THE EARLY CLAIMS OF A MUCH OLDER MEMBER THAT MY APPOINTMENT WOULD "IF NOT MAKE DAN DINEEN TURN OVER IN HIS GRAVE, AT LEAST SIT UP AND TAKE NOTICE!"

I WAS FORTUNATE TO ATTEND A YOUTH DEVELOPMENT CAMP DURING THE SEASON. THIS PROVED AN INVALUABLE OPPORTUNITY TO GAIN EXPERIENCE AND INFORMATION RELATING TO MANY ORGANIZATIONAL ISSUES. VICE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

THIS SEASON HAS SEEN A SUCCESSFUL SEASON ON PATROL. WITH THE PURCHASE AND DONATION OF SEVERAL PIECES OF PATROL EQUIPMENT WE WERE ABLE TO FULFIL OUR PATROL OBLIGATIONS TO THE MAXIMUM PROVIDING AN EFFICIENT RESCUE SERVICE TO THE PUBLIC. THESE PURCHASES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1) 7 PATROL T-SHIRTS (DONATED BY ANTI-CANCER FOUNDATION)
- 2) 1 ACHILLES IRB (PART PURCHASE BY AUSTRALIAN GOVT)
- 3) 10 BUM PACKS (THESE CONTAIN 1 POCKET MASK, NOTE PAD, GLOVES)
- 4) 2 UNIDEN UHF RADIOS
- 5) WATERPROOF RADIO PACKS
- 6) IRB RADIO HARNESS.

UNFORTUNATELY DUE TO FOUR BREAK-INS, WE LOST 2 UHF RADIOS, 2 BINOCULARS AND A LOUD HAILER WHICH DID CAUSE SOME PROBLEMS BUT DUE TO ASSISTANCE FROM MEMBERS WE WERE ABLE TO FULFIL OUR PATROL CONTRACT.

THIS SEASON SAW 9 LIVES SAVED INCLUDING 6 IN IRB, ONCE AGAIN PROVING ITS PRICELESS VALUE TO SAVING LIVES.

Congratulations to David Hemsley On achieving 50 years service to Surf Life Saving. David was presented with his award from National Council at our Annual Dinner held at the Links on 15th of June.

BOAT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

"OH! WHAT A SEASON!" (THE TOYOTA LAMENT). BUT DON'T JUMP IN THE AIR. AS WAS THE CASE LAST YEAR WE STARTED THE SEASON STRONGLY. THERE WERE MANY GREAT EFFORTS BY OUR ROWERS BUT OUR RESULTS AT THE STATES DID NOT REFLECT THE AMOUNT OF APPLICATION AND SACRIFICE THAT WAS EXPENDED.

WITH THE ADVENT OF THE SURF BOAT SUPER SERIES THERE IS A LOT OF SPONSORSHIP MONEY BECOMING AVAILABLE IN THE BOAT ARENA. IT WILL GROW AS THE SERIES EXPANDS.

MARATHON EVENTS ARE A PART OF THE SUPER SERIES. EACH STATE WAS REQUIRED TO RUN AN EVENT AND SELECT A CREW TO BE TRANSPORTED TO SYDNEY FOR THE HARBOUR MARATHON IN EARLY DECEMBER. SUBSEQUENTLY AN INTERCLUB COMMITTEE WAS FORMED AND RULES AND A COURSE WAS DECIDED UPON.

LENNIES TAVERN OF GLENELG SPONSORED THE EVENT. IT WAS HELD ON THE 21ST OF OCT. FROM BRIGHTON TO NORTH HAVEN WITH 20 MIN STOPS AT GLENELG, HENLEY AND SEMAPHORE. TWO RESERVE ROWERS WERE ALLOWED FOR EACH CREW. SO TRAINING BEGAN, WE PURCHASED OUR FIRST SET OF SLIDING SEATS (WE SHOULD HAVE GOT THEM YEARS AGO) AND TRAINED REALLY WELL.

ON THE DAY A STORM BLEW UP, BUT THE EVENT WENT AHEAD AND TURNED OUT A DISASTER FOR US AS OUR BOAT WAS UNMANAGEABLE IN THE STRONG CROSS WINDS. ALTHOUGH WE FINISHED THE COURSE. WE COULD NOT KEEP THE BOAT POINTED IN THE CORRECT DIRECTION. WE FINISHED 2ND LAST.

OH WELL, PUT THAT DOWN TO EXPERIENCE AND ON WITH SUPER SERIES AT GLENELG ON THE 10TH & 11TH OF NOVEMBER. A REALLY SPECTACULAR SET OF 6 RACES COMPLETE WITH CREW CHANGES AND RUNNING LEGS ALL TO BE COMPLETED WITHIN AN HOUR (2 MINUTE CHANGE OVERS BETWEEN EVENTS). ELIMINATION HEATS WERE HELD ON SAT. AND ALTHOUGH WE ROLLED THE BOAT COMING IN ON THE SHORE BREAK WE QUALIFIED IN THE 6 FINALISTS AS MANY CREWS TOOK A LOT OF WATER GETTING OUT.

WE FINISHED THIRD IN THIS SERIES AND COLLECTED \$1050 WHICH MORE THAN PAID FOR MODIFYING THE TONY PARK TO VERTICAL SQUARE BACKED ROWLOCKS AND EQUIDISTANCE ROWING POSITIONS. THAT WAS THE REAL START OF A DISAPPOINTING SEASON. WE HAD THE MODIFICATIONS CARRIED OUT BY A REPUTABLE BOAT BUILDER BY THE 28TH OF DEC. AND OUR NEW SQUARE BACK OARS ARRIVED JUST AFTER. WE THEN SET ALL THE CATCH ANGLES AND RIGGING UP AS ADVISED AND STARTED ADJUSTING TO THE NEW RIG.

THE NEXT CARNIVAL WAS AT GOOLWA ON THE 6TH OF JAN. WHICH WE WON IN A REASONABLY TOUGH SURF.

THE NEXT CARNIVAL ON THE 20TH WAS DEAD FLAT AND AS I WAS AWAY TONY PARK SWEPT THE "A'S" AND WE DID NOT MAKE THE FINALS. OH WELL, LACK OF TRAINING AND CREW CHANGES, WE CAN DO BETTER.

AT THE NEXT CARNIVAL (MOANA 3RD FEB) AGAIN DEAD FLAT. WE AGAIN FAILED TO MAKE THE FINAL AND AFTER BLAMING EACH OTHER AND OR THE AMOUNT OF TRAINING AND EVERYONE ELSE, WE DECIDED THE BOAT RIGGING WAS WRONG AND PUT THE SEATS BACK TO THEIR ORIGINAL POSITION. IMMEDIATELY OUR TIMES IMPROVED OVER THE MEASURED COURSES AT THE LAKE.

AT THE NEXT CARNIVAL AT CHRISTIES ON THE 17TH OF FEB WE WERE COMPETITIVE ENOUGH TO BE PICKED IN THE STATE SQUAD. THE BOAT STILL DID NOT FEEL 100% BUT IT WAS TOO CLOSE TO THE STATES TO MAKE ANY FURTHER MODIFICATIONS TO THE RIG. ALTHOUGH THE BOAT PERFORMED BETTER WE MISSED OUT ON STATE TEAM SELECTION AND THE FINAL AT THE STATES.

SINCE THEN FROM DISCUSSIONS WITH MATT CLYMER (THE ORIGINAL BOAT BUILDER) WE HAVE IDENTIFIED THE RIGGING FAULTS AND ARE CURRENTLY MODIFYING THE BOAT.

THE A CREW SUFFERED TOO MANY CREW CHANGES DURING THE SEASON. WE STARTED WITH ONLY FITZY AND COLIN AVAILABLE FROM LAST YEAR AND ADDED RICHARD WARD EX NORTH HAVEN AND SHANE FROM THE B'S. SHANE HAD TO RETIRE AND SHUTTS FILLED IN BUT ALSO RETIRED. IT APPEARED NO ONE FROM THE OTHER CREWS WANTED TO MAKE THE HUGE COMMITMENT TO ROW A'S. SIMON JENNINGS RETURNED FROM OVERSEAS AT XMAS AND ACCEPTED TO ROW. WE APPRECIATE SIMON'S EFFORTS AND HE PUT IN A HUGE EFFORT TO GET FIT AND LEARN THE FINER POINTS OF TECHNIQUE REQUIRED FOR THE A'S.

WE ALL KNOW THAT CONSISTENCY WINS BOAT RACES AND I HOPE MANY OF LAST YEARS ROWERS RETURN BECAUSE I AM SURE WE HAVE THE ABILITY TO BE THE BEST BOAT CLUB IN SA.

A MAJOR SET BACK HAPPENED ON THE 3RD OF JANUARY WHEN THE B CREW WERE SWEPT INTO THE JETTY IN THE FOSTERS (CHOOK FIELDER) BOAT DURING A SHORT WIND STORM.

THE BOAT WAS BROKEN IN HALF AND WAS A TOTAL WRITE OFF (SEE PHOTO ON THE BACK OF THIS REPORT). WITH THE TONY PARK IN FOR MODIFICATION, THE MAJOR ROGERS BEING RESTORED. THE CLUB WAS LEFT FOR A SHORT WHILE WITH ONLY ONE BOAT (THE JIM DOHERTY) FOR ALL CREWS TO TRAIN IN.

THE EFFORTS OF TONY PARK, JONESY, BURNIE AND DAMIAN ARE APPRECIATED. THEIR RESTORATION AND MODIFICATION TO THE MAJOR ROGERS HAS RESTORED A 1982 BOAT TO TOP CONDITION. THIS IS THE BOAT IN WHICH TONY'S VETERAN CREW WAS PLACED THIRD AT THE STATES.

CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT

SEASON 1990/91 STARTED EARLY WITH THE FIRST AID GROUP INSTRUCTED BY G. BRENNECKE, SUCCESSFULLY PASSING. AFTER ALL THE YEARS, GEOFF FINALLY OBTAINED HIS FIRST AID INSTRUCTORS CERTIFICATE WITH THE HELP OF FIVE VERY CO-OPERATIVE STUDENTS.

TRAINING OVER THE LAST FEW YEARS HAS BEEN SOMEWHAT DIFFERENT THAN THAT OF THE LAST SEASON, MAINLY DUE TO THE NEW TRAINING AID "RESUS - ANNIE" WHICH PROVIDED MANY FORMS OF PRACTICAL TRAINING. "RESUS - ANNIE" IS A FULL SIZE AMBU MANIKAN WITH ARMS, LEGS, CAROTID PULSE AND A LIGHT BOX WHICH DISPLAYS CORRECT/INCORRECT COMPRESSION SITE, DEPTH OF COMPRESSIONS AND BREATH SIZE OF A CHILD/INFANT AND ADULT. APART FROM BEING USED FOR RESUSCITATION, IT ALSO HAD IT'S PLACED IN FIRST AID AND AN AID FOR DISPLAYING TECHNIQUES OF PATIENT ASSESSMENT AND CARE.

DESPITE BEING USED FOR TRAINING SOME CLUB MEMBERS WERE CURIOUS TO SEE WHAT OTHER FUNCTIONS "ANNIE" HAD TO OFFER. PURCHASING THE MANIKAN BEFORE THE SEASON, IT WAS GREATLY USED IN PROFICIENCY TRAINING, BRONZE SQUADS, FIRST AID GROUPS, RESUSCITATION TRAINING AND DEMONSTRATIONS TO CURIOUS PEOPLE.

PROFICIENCY RAN WITHOUT TOO MANY HICCUPS. ALTHOUGH TWO TEST DATES WERE PLANNED, PLUS TRAINING, A NUMBER OF MEMBERS THOUGHTFULLY SHOWED UP ON THOSE DATES. DISAPPOINTINGLY, NOT EVERYONE DID SHOW UP, AND A SERIES OF UNPLANNED PROFICIENCY TESTS WERE HELD TO INCONVENIENCE MYSELF AND S. TRODD. THANKS TO SALLY ALL PROFICIENCY TESTING RAN SMOOTHLY AND EFFICIENTLY. I ALSO WOULD LIKE TO THANK D. SALVEN, P MARTIN, J GOLDSMITH AND G WHITE FOR THE HELP WITH I.R.B. DRIVING, TIMING AND GENERAL SUPERVISION OF THE PROFICIENCY TESTS.

AFTER THE MAIN PROFICIENCY TEST WAS OVER A SMALL GROUP OF QUALI'S GOT UNDERWAY, BEING INSTRUCTED BY S.NELSON. BEING A QUALI GROUP THEY WERE AROUND THE AGE OF 12/13 AND NOT TOO KEEN TO LEARN, BUT I THOUGHT SHELLY HANDLED THE GROUP WELL, AS THE EXAMINER TOLD HER WHILE CONGRATULATING THE GROUP.

THE FIRST BRONZE SQUAD TO GET UNDERWAY WAS A YOUNG GATHERING OF FEMALES. INSTRUCTORS WERE HARD TO FIND AT FIRST, BUT WHEN THE ENTHUSIASTIC GROUP MADE AN APPEARANCE AT THE CLUB THE MALE EAGERNESS WAS OVERWHELMING, BUT K TUCKER AND P MARTIN TOOK THE CHALLENGE. THE OTHER MEMBERS TOOK ON THE CHEER SQUAD CHALLENGE.

THE GROUP WAS LEARNING FAST WHEN ANOTHER BRONZE SQUAD GOT STARTED, UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF G WHITE. THIS GROUP WAS KEEN TO TRAIN, BUT WERE MORE EAGER TO DO TRAINING AT A LOCAL GLENELG PUB, UNTIL THEY REALISED THAT THEIR INSTRUCTOR WASN'T GOING TO BE THE EXAMINER OF THEIR EXAM. BOTH SQUADS HAD TROUBLE WITH EXAM DATES BUT ALL PASSED SUCCESSFULLY.

ALL THROUGH THE YEAR, NOTICES OF ADVANCED RESUSCITATION WERE DISPLAYED WITH TRAINING DATES. WITH OVER TWENTY NON-PROFICIENT ARC HOLDERS, NOT ONE SEEMED INTERESTED TO TRAIN TO BE ONCE AGAIN PROFICIENT AT THIS TECHNICAL AWARD. ONLY ONE PERSON WAS WILLING TO GAIN THE ARC, A VERY DISAPPOINTING EFFORT FOR THE LACK OF ENTHUSIASM, FROM THOSE MEMBERS IN QUESTION.

CROWDS WERE LOW FOR ARC BUT HIGH FOR THE RADIO OPERATIONS CERTIFICATE. AN OVERALL OF THIRTEEN PEOPLE SHOWED FOR TRAINING AND TWO INSTRUCTORS. IT WAS A DIFFERENT SCENE WHEN THE EXAM CAME AROUND. THREE PEOPLE OBTAINED THE ROC AND JUST ONE INSTRUCTOR WAS THE RESULT.

OUR CLUB CAPTAIN WAS BACK ON THE SCENE WHEN SHE HAD THE RESPONSIBILITY OF A BRONZE SQUAD. THE SQUAD WAS ANOTHER GROUP OF FEMALES AND ONE "FRILL NECK". THERE WAS ALREADY A BRONZE SQUAD TRAINING AT THE TIME, SO BOTH GROUPS MERGED INTO ONE, AFTER ONE GROUP WAS DECREASED. ON THE EXAM DAY, 7.30 AM AT THE CLUB SETTING UP FOR A 8.00 AM START. THE SQUAD WAS READY AND KEEN, EVEN UP TO WHEN NO EXAMINER SHOWED UP. THE EXAM WAS RE-ORGAINSED AND EVERYONE PASSED WITH ONE TRAINING OFFICER.

AFTER STATE AND AUSSIES WERE OVER THE CLUB STARTED GOING THROUGH ITS WINTER VACANCY, EXCEPT FOR THE KEEN GROUP OF IRB DRIVERS WHO WERE TO HAVE AN INSTRUCTIONAL/EXAMINATION WEEKEND WHICH WAS HELD AT CHITION ROCKS SLSC. FROM WHAT I HEARD, THE WORD "TURTLE" WAS A COMMON SAYING WITHIN THE HENLEY CAMP ALL WEEKEND. DESPITE ALL THE ROLL OVERS AND A LATE SATURDAY NIGHT, THREE GUYS OBTAINED THE IRB DRIVERS CERTIFICATE. G WHITE WAS THE INSTRUCTOR AND P MARTIN IS A PROBATIONARY EXAMINER FOR FURTHER IRB EXAMS.

I WAS VERY PLEASED TO NOTICE THAT HENLEY HAS SIX MEMBERS NOW ON THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS, AND MANY MORE SEEM INTERESTED.

THE SEASON WAS A HARDER YEAR THAN I HAD EXPECTED, AND I WOULD LIKE TO THANK THE FOLLOWING FOR THEIR SUPPORT AND GUIDANCE THROUGHOUT THE YEAR: K FITZGERALD, S TRODD, P MARTIN, J GOLDSMITH, G WHITE, J DOHERTY, D SLAVEN, G BRENNECKE, K TUCKER, S NELSON AND ALL THE REST.

FROM THE VERY OUTSET OF THE FOUNDATION OF THE CLUB. THE CLUB CHAMPION HAS BEEN RECORDED YEAR BY YEAR AND RECOGNISED FOR THE EFFORT THAT IS BEHIND SUCH AN AWARD.

TO BE THE CLUB CHAMPION ON TWO OR MORE OCCASIONS IS A FURTHER FEATHER IN THE CAP, BUT TO HAVE WON TEN CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS IS INDEED A MEMORABLE EVENT THAT REFLECTS GREATLY ON THE RECIPIENT. HE HAS BEEN A SUBSTANTIAL ASSET TO THE CLUB IN HIS TIRELESS APPROACH TO TRAINING AND IMPARTING HIS KNOWLEDGE TO THE JUNIOR MEMBERS AND TO THOSE WHO ARE BOARD/SKI ENTHUSIASTS. WHERE OTHERS HAVE, FOR ONE REASON OR ANOTHER, TRANSFERRED THEIR ALLEGIANCE TO OTHER CLUBS, ANDREW HAS STUCK WITH US THROUGH THICK AND THIN, AND HAS INDEED BEEN AN INSPIRATION TO THE YOUNGSTERS.

TREASURER'S REPORT 1990/91

IT IS WITH PLEASURE THAT I PRESENT MY THIRD TREASURERS REPORT FOR THE HENLEY SURF LIFESAVING CLUB INC. IN MY FIRST TWO REPORTS I FOUND IT DIFFICULT TO REPRESENT THE CLUB'S FINANCIAL POSITION IN A MANNER THAT WAS EASILY UNDERSTANDABLE TO THE MAJORITY OF CLUB MEMBERS. AS A CONSEQUENCE I HAVE NOT INCLUDED THE PROFIT AND LOSS STATEMENT WHICH HAS BEEN A SOURCE OF MUCH CONFUSION. THE IMPORTANT STATEMENT IS NOW THE ONE ENTITLED "FUNDS STATEMENT" WHICH SHOWS A BOTTOM LINE IMPROVEMENT IN THE CLUB'S EQUITY, OR FINANCIAL POSITION, OF \$31,061.63 FROM LAST YEAR. THE "BALANCE SHEET" DISPLAYS THIS AS AN IMPROVEMENT OF THE CLUBS ASSETS (WHAT THE CLUB OWNS) MINUS THE CLUB'S LIABILITIES (WHAT THE CLUB OWES). THE \$31,061.63 CAN BE SEEN ON THE "BALANCE SHEET" AS A \$1,573.90 INCREASE IN CURRENT ASSETS (CASH, DEPOSITS, STOCK ON HAND), A \$14,242.94 INCREASE IN THE BALANCE OF THE AMY FORWOOD TRUST, A \$10,154.00 INCREASE IN FIXED ASSETS (MATERIAL AND EQUIPMENT HELD BY THE CLUB) AND A \$5,090.79 DECREASE IN THE CLUBS ONE LIABILITY, A LOAN OWING TO STATE CENTRE. THE OTHER STATEMENT OF INTEREST IS THE "STATEMENT OF RECEIPTS AND PAYMENTS" WHICH SUMMARISES MONIES COMING IN AND GOING OUT OF THE CLUB'S CHEQUE ACCOUNT. THE MAJORITY OF THE CLUB'S BUSINESS IS PERFORMED THROUGH THIS ACCOUNT. THE OTHER STATEMENTS ATTACHED DETAIL THE COMPONENTS OF ITEMS WITH LARGE BALANCES.

SIGNIFICANT FEATURES OF THE ACCOUNTS: BAR TAKINGS WERE DOWN \$5,353.55 FROM LAST YEAR WITH A CONSEQUENT DECREASE IN PROFIT OF \$2,368.37. TO BALANCE THIS DECREASE THE SOCIAL COMMITTEE SHOWED AN IMPROVEMENT OF \$2,217.13 THANKS MAINLY TO THE EFFORTS OF MATT AND PAUL NEWMAN. MOST OF THE SOCIAL INCOME WAS GENERATED, HOWEVER, PRIOR TO CHRISTMAS AND HAD THAT ENTHUSIASM BEEN MAINTAINED FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE SEASON THE CLUB COULD HAVE MADE AN EVEN LARGER GAIN IN THIS AREA. IN GENERAL OTHER EXPENSES AND RECEIPTS WERE MAINTAINED ALONG SIMILAR LEVELS TO LAST YEAR.

EXPENDITURE ON MAJOR ITEMS (CAPITAL EXPENDITURE AND EQUIPMENT) WAS DOWN \$2,948.45 FROM \$22,295.04 TO \$19,346.59.

SUMMARY: I BELIEVE THAT THE HENLEY SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC. IS IN A VERY SOUND FINANCIAL POSITION AND RETAINS A CONSISTENT ABILITY TO GENERATE SURPLUSES AS WELL AS CONSTANTLY IMPROVING FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT. AREAS THAT COULD DO WITH IMPROVEMENT INCLUDE: MAINTENANCE AND CONTROL OF ASSETS, RECORDING OF RECEIPTS AND PAYMENTS, AND MAINTAINING A MORE CONSISTENT INCOME FROM

SOCIAL ACTIVITIES (WE ARE MISSING TOO MANY OPPORTUNITIES).

THANK YOU TO DAMIEN SLAVEN AND KEVIN FITZGERALD FOR THEIR HELP IN SHOULDERING MY DAY-TO-DAY DUTIES IN BETWEEN MY INFREQUENT APPEARANCES TO THE CLUB.
