Congratulations to Peter Fox who competed extremely well to win a Bronze Medallion. Well done Peter and keep the good work up.

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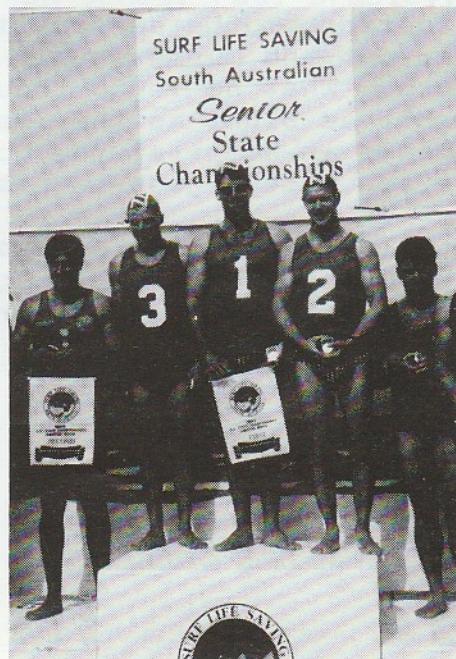
BEACH TEAM REPORT

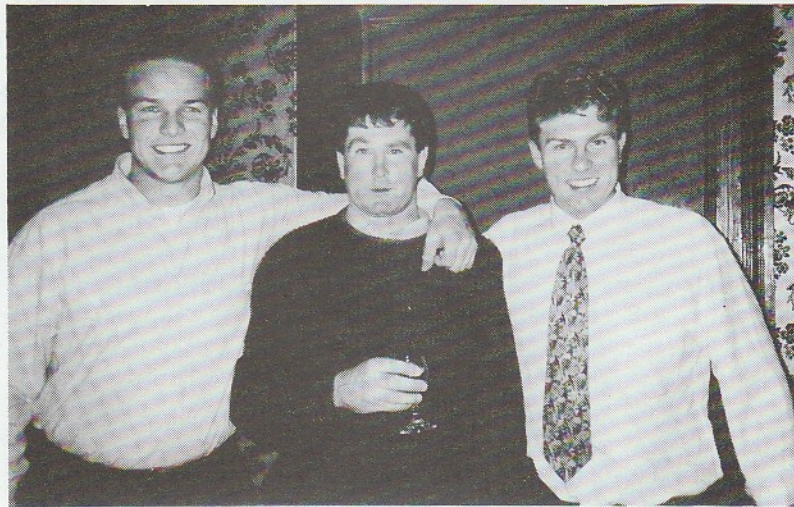

BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

The Club for years has made a number of applications to Council to rebuild that section of the Club erected in 1956.

That section of the Club has, through the lack of a regulated maintenance program, deteriorated to the degree that it was obvious a major reconstruction was necessary.

Knowing the concern of the Club, Council submitted a plan that would have seen the Club established on the site opposite the Henley Hotel, shared with four other sporting or business enterprises. The location, some distance from the centre of Henley Beach, together with the lack of space, having to share the building with others, was not in the best interests of the Club.

Accordingly, at an organised breakfast arranged for interested parties on Friday 10th March, 1989, at which the Major, Mr Fred ANGUS and Councillor Bob POTTS attended. The Club placed an alternate proposal to Council which would see the 1986 section of the Clubrooms demolished and on the same area the Club would rebuild on half of that site, with the floor levels being similar to that of the brown brick section built in 1982. The remainder would then be available to Council to build alternate changerooms/toilet facilities for the general public, bearing in mind the disgraceful condition of the existing toilets at that time.

That proposition also included a Traffic Management program that would see an extra 32 car parking spaces available in close proximity to the Jetty for beach lovers from the eastern districts.

That proposal did not meet with the approval of the Council, which later accused the Club of a lack of response to their South Henley proposal.

Another matter which caused some concern was the fact that Council had placed a ban on the use of the set of stairs to the Top Room from the kitchen area. When constructed in 1956 the gradient of the stairs was quite acceptable, but in later years the building safety regulations had been changed. The Stairs were not in accordance with standards, and in the event of an accident, a claim for insurance would fail. The same applied to the stairs down to the gear room/ski shed.

1991 saw a further application to Council to rebuild along the same lines as in 1989. Following a negative response to this application saw the establishment of a working party set up between the Club and Council with the object of locating a suitable site for the Club to be relocated, bearing in mind that both the Dept. of Environment (Coastal Protection Board) and Council had in their long term plans the removal of the old swimming pool and in fact our Clubrooms. Five sites were recommended by a planning sub-committee of Council. Three were residential building blocks, one was sharing the Henley Sailing Clubrooms at West Beach, and the fifth was the car park site on the north side of the Square.

The Car Park site would have been ideal IF Council had been able to locate a developer who would be prepared to include the Clubrooms in the residential construction envisaged by Council. It was suggested that such a development would not be available for at least five years.

Following an inspection of the Hall section of the Clubrooms and the old pool change-rooms underneath by the Building Inspector, Council declared the Hall unsafe in-so-much-as the foundations of the western wall had deteriorated to the extent that they had declared the Hall unsafe. By bolstering the western wall from underneath we were able to gain an extension of time to plan a re-building program.

Our finances were in pretty good shape with the support of the bequest of the late Miss Amy FORWARD, but, in consideration of the extensive re-building programme envisaged, further financial support, in the form of a grant, or donation, or bank loan, had to be considered.

1992 saw an application lodged with the Commonwealth Govt. for a grant of \$200,00 under the Sports & Recreation Program which would have seen the entire 1956 section of the Clubrooms demolished and re-built in a similar manner to that proposed to Council in 1989. Unfortunately, with the number of similar applications from this State, we were unsuccessful in our bid.

Not to be undaunted a further application was lodged for a similar program in 1993. This application reduced the re-building program to relocating the female change-rooms/toilets to within the main building from the Hall, the demolition of the Hall, and the relocation of the second stairs to the Top Room from inside to outside the southern wall. This application was for the sum of \$125,000 being on a dollar for dollar basis as Council would donate \$20,000 and the Club the remaining \$105,000.

Having been assured that our application would receive favourable consideration, it was decided that, in an effort to have the Club in readiness for the ensuing season, that the Hall should be demolished in accordance with the Council plan.

The female members took over the gent's facilities, whilst the male members utilised the sauna showers and the Top Room toilets. This step was taken in the belief that the inconvenience was in the short term.

Again, unfortunately, we were advised that our application for a grant had failed owing to the number of applicants and there being only so much in the 'kitty' to go around. It was indeed disconcerting to believe that our campaign to seek funds in establishing suitable accommodation for our female members had been refused when a kindred Club, already established in a near new Clubhouse, had been successful in an application to modify their kitchen.

Not to be greatly concerned by these events, the Club made a further application to Council to re-build. In consideration that we had complied with Council in the removal of the Hall, AND that our proposal included the removal and relocation of the inner staircase, we believed that the application was a mere formality. After all, we had removed some 25 metres from the length of the Clubrooms and the application was for about four metres of that length in which to build the 'outside' stairs.

Then came an about face by Council. After failing to agree with our previous suggestions that Council could utilise that section of the space taken up by the Hall for public amenities, they now declared that they were going to build such facilities, not adjacent to the Club's proposed extensions, but actually on the site of those extensions.

An urgent meeting resolved that Council would build their toilet block on the footway on the east side of the kitchen.

Some elected members of Council did not see the logic of our application. They were of the opinion that, having removed the Hall, the remainder of the Clubrooms was to be considered as the original building. They then argued that because an application was before them to make additions to the remaining section of the Clubrooms, that it was in fact an extension to an existing building being erected on Crown Land, and that before it could give sanction to such an application, that a Public Meeting should be called to give local residents an opportunity of expressing their concern.

That Public Meeting was held under the chairmanship of the Major, Mr. Bob RANDALL, in the Clubrooms. No dissenting speakers were heard. The application was then placed before the State Planning Commission and subsequently approved.

In the meantime the application had been 'laying on the table' at Council. It was decreed that, in consideration that the costs of building the toilet block had not been included in the current year's budget, that the matter should continue to 'lay on the table' until after the Local Government elections.

This prompted our proposal that the re-building programme be of two separate stages, with the Club going proceeding as per the plan as Stage One, and Council following up with Stage Two when they are financially able to do so.

So that is where we are at this time. Our architect and engineers are working on plans and specifications to submit to the Building Inspector for approval.

With the benefit of hindsight it may have been better to have refrained from demolishing the Hall and continued to permit the females the use of their change-rooms, knowing that Council were reluctant to permit the use of the Hall for any purpose.

In that way we would not have incurred the difficulties that have been endured. Our efforts to expedite matters backfired.

TREASURERS REPORT

I am pleased to present my second report as Treasurer. I am pleased to say that this report shows better results than last year.

Over the year the Club made a surplus of \$21,034.46 compared to last years figure of \$3255.00. This is due largely to a reduction in spending by over \$10,000 and an increase in Income received. It was pleasing to see members of the Club starting to look after the equipment of the Club and this reduced the amount of money we had to spend on repairs. Over the year the Club also purchased some \$23,500 worth of new equipment with each area obtaining new equipment.

Even though this year was a more pleasing result, we must all be aware of the on going problems we face financially as a Club. Over the next year or two, we will be spending most of the Clubs money on the rebuilding of the Club, this will mean that a large portion of the Clubs investments will be used to finance the rebuilding costs, as well as that a large portion of the yearly surplus (i.e. interest from investments) will be evaporated. Members of this Club need to continue to put time and effort into the Club to ensure that over the next few years the Club will not only be able to afford to rebuild the Club, but also to continue the day to day running costs of the Club.


