

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The season now under review has been quite successful financially due to the efforts of all sections of the club and from the wonderful sponsors and supporters who continue to show in a financial way their appreciation to the work being done to protect the public who visit the beach at Henley.

Almost all areas have showed an increase in income and in particular the performance of the upstairs facilities and that of the social committee should be highlighted.

Bar profit increased by almost 30% with excellent percentage being maintained. The increase was due mainly to the regular social activities conducted in the clubrooms.

Mark Searcy, his volunteer barmen/women, and the many members who helped contribute to these excellent results should feel very proud of their achievement.

As mentioned in last years report it was time, (after almost a decade of uncertainty surrounding the clubroom extensions and the need to save as much money as possible) to purchase much needed equipment to help boost the performances of our competitors. Reports from other officers will show that this strategy has in the main, been successful.

The Boat, Board, Ski and Junior areas all received a generous supply of new equipment and this should now only require regular replacement which can be monitored and budgeted for each season.

The purchase of \$26,000 worth of equipment was at the expense of the building improvements and it was a little disappointing that little was done in regard to the kitchen and the furniture for the top room. Perhaps the next twelve months will see the social facilities finally completed.

We welcome our new sponsors to the club and in particular Boral Masonry and Onga pumps who both supported the project to purchase the new boat.

Carlton United Breweries has continued to supply their products to the Club and we are indeed grateful to CUB, Gary Kirwan and to Stewart Baird.

The South Australia Government again gave grants of \$6000 to each of the lifesaving clubs in South Australia and these funds

were required to be used for patrol and administrative purposes.

The Henley SLSC is in a sound financial position and has the ability to continue improving its facilities and at the same time generate surpluses each year. Members must continue to seek further avenues to raise funds and should try to become more active in fund raising projects so that the work load can be shared and not left to the same group each time.

Again I record the pleasure I receive from being your Treasurer, due mainly to working with a small group of keen young lifesavers who have the same ambition to see our Club vibrant and successful in all areas of lifesaving.

My thanks again to Peter Brass for auditing our records, to Debbie Parsons and Joe Bayer for handling the Junior finances and of course to Teresa who at times seems to be helping everybody with their jobs including mine.

#### YOUTH DEVELOPMENT CAMP JANUARY 1997 LAKE AINSWORTH

Camp Report by Greg Fletcher

#### Introduction

The first time I heard about the leadership camp was from two friends who had attended previous camps. They told me that it was the most informative and exciting camp they had ever been on. I was to discover they were right.

Having been a part of Surf Lifesaving for 16 years and looking to continue on as a Management Committee member, I believe the camp would not only benefit me personally but also the Henley Surf Lifesaving Club.

In December 1996, I attended the State leadership camp at the Echunga police training centre to gain some insight into these type of leadership camps. Shane Daw was excellent as camp leader and the experience we gained enable me to get the most out of the National Camp.

#### Camp Report

People attending this camp were identified by their clubs as potential leaders. They are highly motivated individuals committed to Surf Lifesaving but to keep these Youths attention and concentration for 6 days is no easy task but the Management team, led by Steve Leahy did an exceptional job. Their enthusiasm was contagious and everyone quickly felt at home and comfortable with each other.

Coming from an Aussie rules background I understood the difficulties in getting 20 people to work together. So I thought 60 people attempting to work together would be impossible. Through the efforts of the management team and the total commitment all participants showed to each other, failure was not an option.

Each morning would begin with fitness which I thoroughly enjoyed, even at 5.30am in the rain. This would freshen everyone up from the previous nights activities and provided training for the gold medallion.

During the day we would attend lectures with a variety of speakers and topics. All of them were relevant and interesting, although I benefited from some more than others. Physical activities such as team games and Lifesaver skills training provided a break in between lectures and some valuable team bonding.

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Patrol scenario's in surf was something I wasn't accustomed to and provided great hands on experience. He caught the eye of State selectors and was in many State Teams competing against interstate and overseas rivals with great distinction. To become a member of the State Relay Team is indeed and an honour in beach events. Bentley achieved that feat on several occasions.

His interest in the Club was not confined to athleticism. He, like many others before him, knew only too well that capable management of the Club's affairs goes hand in hand with good fellowship and camaraderie. He took his instructor's certificate in 1965. His employment was such that he worked mainly with figures and as such turned his talents to the position of Treasurer in 1975/6.


