President's Foreword

I am pleased once again to be able to report another very successful year for Henley SLSC.

In a similar vein to the previous twelve months we have performed admirably in all areas and I thank all those members and helpers who have contributed to our ongoing success.

We continue to trade profitably and have set further funds aside for a future clubrooms upgrade. Valuable new sponsorship, an SA Government Active Clubs Grant and disbursements from the State investment fund, owned by the 18 Clubs have assisted us in that regard. Bar trade through the Top Room has improved markedly and we thank Barry Duhne for his professionalism.

Our patrol obligations were met enthusiastically by the members and again we were delighted to welcome so many youngsters making the transition from Nippers into the Senior Club, upgrading their Life Saving skills and joining us on the Patrol Roster.

Our Junior Division had another magnificent year and on behalf of all members I thank the Junior Committee, Age Group Leaders and the Mums and Dads who help out week after week. In probably the most exiting result for years our Juniors finished fourth at their State Championships, which is a remarkable result given our size compared to many of the other clubs.

I have lost count of the number of Senior members who have commented to me on the successes of our youngsters.

We have a wonderful group of children at the Club and have developed a number of initiatives to ensure we keep them interested.

We have formed a small committee to work through the issues regarding the future of the Clubrooms. Essentially there are three options open to us. The first is to apply for funding from the Emergency Services Fund and Charles Sturt Council to assist us demolish the existing building and replace it with a modern, practical and possibly multi user facility on the existing site. This is obviously an expensive option and whilst we are prepared to pay our share we do qualify for assistance from the Emergency Services Fund, however the council's level of assistance is yet to be determined.

The second option would be to carry out a major redevelopment of our existing premises which at present has an impractical layout over 5 floor levels and has inadequate kitchen facilities if we are to attract more revenue through the Top Room. This option would also include extending the Top Room south over the Board and Ski storage areas.

The third option is to remain with what we have now, bearing in mind that maintenance has been largely overlooked in the past and parts of the building are deteriorating under us.

As I mentioned in last year's report, most of the committee has been involved in developing a Strategic Plan which maps out the path we must take to ensure continued growth and success of the Club.

The Plan is now at the stage where the Board and Committee structures have been remodelled ready for elections at the 2004 Annual General Meeting. Whilst some key positions will be elected on the night as has been the practice in the past, others will be filled by expression of interest and appointed by the Board of Management following the AGM.

I particularly wish to thank Mark Travers for his leadership in bringing the Strategic Plan to completion.

Ongoing funding is always a concern and we have included a number of initiatives in the Strategic Plan to address that issue.

It will be the responsibility of future Board of Management and Committee members to ensure the plan is observed.

The Annual General Meeting on 23rd July 2004 will mark the end of the 79th year of Henley Surf Life Saving Club.


We have planned a function to be held in October 2004 to bring past and present members together to welcome in the 80th year of our operation.

Secretary's Report

As secretary I really do not have much to report. However, there have been some changes and developments this past season, which are worthy of comment.

2003 – 2004 the 79th season for Henley Surf Life Saving Club, saw the introduction of a number of measures by Surf Life Saving Australia, SLS South Australia and our own Club.

These measures included:

Member Protection programme – aimed at ensuring a rigid but fair process is in place to screen seniors involved in any way with our junior members. Police clearance checks are conducted through state centre for all seniors involved with juniors and a number (although we hope it will increase) of members have commenced the "Nipper Safe" programme conducted by the SA Police and State Centre. Part of the Club process now includes the "Nipper" sign in/out process where juniors are signed in to a session by a parent or guardian and that same person is required to sign out the junior at the end of the session.

Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) programme – as peak bodies, Surf Life Saving Australia, South Australia and our Club Management Committee are now responsible for ensuring the Club facilities are up to certain standards. Members must ensure their own safety and that of other members. To this end a member induction process is now in place.

Changes to Proficiency Testing – see comments in the Chief Instructors report.

While all members the management committee recognise that such changes to routine and established process at a Club as steeped in tradition as Henley can be difficult, we also recognise the necessity of protecting our juniors, maintaining safety standards and generally staying in step with recognised established and business protocols.

I will not be standing for any position with Henley next season as I have accepted a job in Perth

WA and will be moving with my family in mid May 2004. Unfortunately, I will miss the Presentation Night and AGM.

Vice-Captain's Report

This year we finished 7th in the State for Patrol Efficiency, a great improvement on last year when we finished around 15th. This year we also tried out a split patrol roster, which seemed to work well as it was easier to find a substitute when you needed one. The only short fall was how quick your next patrol came around, which was about every 2 or 3 weeks. As it is easier to find a substitute, maybe we can afford to have a smaller number of members in each patrol group, which will mean more patrol groups, and your patrol will not come around so quickly.

Looking at the current number of IRB Drivers, IRB Crews and ARC holders, we could have up to 15 patrol groups, and still meet our patrol contract, which would be 5 more patrol groups than we had this season, and 1-2 extra weeks between rostered patrols.

To make this work, our patrol members need to make sure they turn up to every rostered patrol, or at least ensure they have a substitute, if unable to make it. Members also need to ensure they complete at least 16 patrol hours by 31st December to be eligible to compete at States.

Thankyou to all members who completed their patrol obligations, and contributed to Henley meeting it's patrol contract.

Junior Report

Once again, in season 2003-2004 the Henley nippers continued to improve in all areas. We had a club best, "fourth", at the state titles, a state team representative, record numbers on the beach, record numbers of parents helping out and record numbers of parents obtaining awards. All this would suggest that we can relax and enjoy the fruits of past seasons hard work. Unfortunately, nothing could be further from the truth. We now need to put systems in place to help those Henley members make the transition from Junior carnival competitors to Senior carnival competitors.

We need to harness the enthusiasm our Club has for the junior programme and apply it to assist in junior development. For the programme to succeed the emphasis must be on surf lifesaving and competition events. This will require an increased input by patrol captains. We need to find ways to make weekend patrols relevant and enjoyable. The experience, expertise and enthusiasm of current patrolling members, in areas such as IRB, Tube Rescue, First Aid, Resuscitation, Board Rescue and Radio use needs to be passed onto our Junior members. Any members interested in helping with midweek training or mentoring our younger competitors, your help will be appreciated.

As I mentioned previously this season was a great success and with the continued support of so many fine volunteers I am sure we can continue to improve in the future. GO HENLEY





Treasurer's Report

It gives me pleasure to present the 2004 Financial Report to the members of the Henley Surf Life Saving Club.

The Henley Surf Life Saving Club, following a successful 79th year of operation, remains in a sound financial position. An operating surplus of \$14,933 and a healthy cash surplus of \$31,599 have allowed the Club to service the needs of it's members and the community throughout the year, while retaining significant reserves to aid in future growth and development.

During this reporting period, there has been an increase in cash held by the Club to a total of \$41,915. This is significant in that it provides the foundations for future capital works and expansion in and around the Club.

The Management team thanks all members for assisting in securing additional corporate support. The Club has once again benefited from the support of it's sponsors and donors with sponsorship increasing by \$7,000 in 2004.

The Club also recognises the generous contribution of \$10,500 this year from the trustees of the Surf Life Saving South Australia Trust Fund and the SA State Government.

In addition, recognition must be given to those who contributed to the fundraising activities of the Club during the year. Your support and time is very much appreciated.

The Bar Manager is to be congratulated on improving the Top Room Trading results. Top Room Profits have improved by \$5,5000 this year, primarily due to containment of operating expenses.

Trading results were offset by a significant paper write down in the value of Patrol Uniform Stock holdings. The National patrol Uniform Sponsorship deal with DHL prevents members from wearing Patrol Uniforms previously held in the Clothing Stock by the Club.

The Club has wisely invested \$16,417 in new competition craft and other club equipment for senior and junior members.

Total competition fees for both Senior and Junior events increased markedly, with entry fees per competitor significantly higher than previous years.

Club Maintenance cost also increased markedly as the Club infrastructure and equipments showing signs of ageing.

I thank all members for their support and patience this year. In particular, I would like to thank Daniel Graham for his assistance in preparing the End of Year Financial Report.
