President's Foreword

Our Club has once again made an admirable contribution to the Community through the thousands of volunteer hours given by our members to ensure the beach going public can enjoy themselves in a safe environment. Twenty two major rescues were performed this season.

In a major boost to our services, we recently took delivery of a defibrillator through the generosity of Osborne Cogeneration Pty Ltd. Our members will be trained in the use of the device during winter and it will dramatically increase the chance of successful resuscitation in critical situations.

Again, drowning remains the number one threat along our coastline and beachgoers continue to underestimate the risks presented by the surf, tidal movement and sandbars at what some people consider to be safe and quiet beaches.

Our Junior Division has continued to reward us for the hard work that began several years ago as we see a constant stream of young teenagers move into the Senior ranks. We are retaining those teenage members and now have more members in the 14 to 18 year age group than ever before, which ensures a strong future for our great organisation. Our Nippers aged 7 to 13 continue to thrive and we welcome all those new families who have joined us during the past twelve months.

We continue to move closer to the redevelopment of our Clubrooms. Council recently approved \$75,000. in its 2007/2008 budget to assist with preliminary design and specification which is a major step forward. Latest estimates indicate a total rebuild would cost in the order of \$2.4m and we hope that Council will contribute 33% of that cost, in line with the contributions made by the other SA coastal Councils to the redeveloped Surf Life Saving Clubs in their districts.

We especially and sincerely thank Councillors Jim Fitzpatrick, Anna Rau and Paul Sykes for their support, advice and encouragement that has enabled us to get this far. Our goal remains to construct the new building during 2008.

I must express concern at some feeling within the Community that there are too many Surf Life Saving Clubs within the Charles Sturt Council district. It is unfortunate that the few who hold that view may be in a position to voice their opinions and be heard by many.

I have had to defend our need to exist in our current location and not amalgamate with another club at an alternate site on various occasions during the past year.

Our Clubrooms are situated in the location that demands the greatest attention. The attractions of the Square and jetty, together with the proximity to direct public transport through of the City of Adelaide result in Henley being among the 3 most patronised beaches along the metropolitan coast.

It would be senseless and foolish to suggest that neither our service nor Clubrooms are required on the existing site.

There is also a misconception that we are mainly a sporting organisation. For the record, less than 5% of our Senior members competed on a regular basis during the 2006/07 season.

On a positive note I wish to congratulate all members on the outstanding success of our inaugural Bendigo Bank Henley SLSC BIG ROW, for which a group of our members rowed a surf boat from Stansbury on Yorke Peninsula back to the Club at Henley, some 68 kilometres.

The event was conceived over a drink and grew into the biggest ever fundraising event in our history. We set an ambitious target of \$30,000. and raised just over \$39,000. Through media exposure we continued to be approached by individuals and organisations up to a month after the event and the total that can be attributed to the Row is closer to \$43,000.



You will find more detail on the Row within this report; stories about the Row will surface in the years ahead and some of them might be true, but everyone concerned with the event or celebrations afterward had a ball and we hope to make it an annual event.

I particularly thank our former member John Butterfield who generously provided is luxury liner as principal support and communications boat, and Mr Robert Gerard who loaned us his 22 foot inflatable tender that was used to ferry crews between the support boat and surf boat.

Special guest at the Big Row celebrations was Max Bray, a member way back in the late 1930s. Max had read about our rebuilding plans and still holding fond memories of his days at Henley, he wished to help us out.

On Big Row day Max handed us a cheque for \$10,000. !!

We thank you most sincerely Max, and assure you the money will be put to the best possible use.

Last year we acknowledged Jim Doherty's 70 year involvement at Henley. This year Jim was recognised at the Australian Championships for his 50 years of service as an Official at National level.

The entire Club congratulates Jim on this remarkable achievement.

As always, sincere thanks to our volunteer members, families, friends and supporters for their ongoing support.

The exciting times will continue.

2007 - Year Of The Surf Lifesaver




In 2004 the Australian government announced that 2007 would be officially known as the Year of the Surf Lifesaver, the first time a community-based organisation has received such an honour.

Beach Committee

The Beach Committee has met several times over the past season. It's great to see how conscientiously our younger members (Zac Jessup, Ben Moore and Daniel Sheehy) have adopted senior roles within the club.

On the Lifesaving front, there was a professional and thorough contribution from our lifesaving advisors (Paul Leonard and Tony Tammita), Vice Captain (Cecelia Owens), IRB Officer (Andrew "Reggie" Lindsay), First Aid Officer (Steve Moore) and our Radio Officer (Shane Johns). It's been a long haul, but the contributions of the club officers responsible for these areas have enabled an almost seamless operational status of all of our processes and equipment.

The Competition Area still requires more work. At this stage we have 2 main cohorts of competitors, including a dedicated group of Masters and an enthusiastic group of youngsters. David Foureur and Andrew Lanyon have gone well beyond the call of duty in their provision of ski and board training sessions. These contributions by our experienced members cannot be underestimated. It is this example that will hopefully be adopted by many of our other members and in other competition areas. There is plenty of talent around transitioning from juniors and from our new members. Next season, a more coordinated effort will be made to give our new members some experience of various competition areas. The one way we can all contribute is to make a big effort to include our new members in all of our ongoing club activities.

Over the last 5 years, our lifesaving performance has improved, but it seems that there are less competitors. We have recruited many new members. Most of our new members have stayed active within the club, so the next step is to get some teams together and form the basis of a club membership that will look after both Lifesaving and Competition well into the future.

Lifesaving

I am proud to announce that we have performed 22 rescues this season. 100 years ago the Surf Lifesaving organization was formed after a series of freak waves washed a large number of swimmers into deep water. Many, but not all, were saved. What we do today is the result of 100 years of evolution and development. We are also fortunate to be involved in one of the most iconic of Australian organizations. In the "Year of the Surf Lifesaver" we can all be proud that we have done exactly what our organization was created to do. I have no doubt that there are several people still walking around today that owe their lives to our diligence and professionalism.

I should also mention that our new members have provided Lifesaving services well beyond their experience. Lime patrol did a great job of our only patrol inspection this year. Gerard Kenny, Justin Barbaro and Lee Emmett's performance on their first ever patrol inspection (and their second patrol), helped to get Henley to 7th position in the State Patrol competition (well done Chiton!). Roy Menner and Gerard Kenny took on a Radio Room duty when the patrols rostered were unable to provide personnel. We had a mass rescue in difficult conditions in February. Many of the rescuers were in their first few weeks of active membership. It is a credit to their effort and competence as well as a reflection on the high standard of our award training at Henley.

Paul Leonard completed Certificate II paperwork on every single patrolling member. The amount of work required for this was huge. All members now have a nationally recognised qualification in addition to their Bronze Medallion due entirely to Paul's characteristic attention to detail and hard work. Thanks Paul.

To every member that has made an effort to fulfill their patrol obligations, I would like to extend my sincere thanks. Everyone doing their bit for the club and the community is what has enabled us to do our job so well this season.

To our trainers, Paul Leonard, Leah Panakera-Thorpe, Shelby Miller, Cec Owens, Nikki Bouveng, Linda Willis, Steve Talbot, Andrew "Reggie" Lindsay, Carly Lutze, Amy Moore and a bit from me too. Our trainers have collectively trained 129 awards since the end of last season up to 28th May 2007. Thanks on behalf of the entire club. We wouldn't be operational without this work.



Our New Members: Well done. Many of you have already been involved in a variety of activities. As well as patrols, our new members are helping in the kitchen and the bar, organising functions, helping with water cover, taking part in social functions and generally getting really involved in their club. It's fabulous to have you all on board. Thank you for your efforts and enthusiasm.

Finally, the quiet achievers. These people are the backbone of the club. For every job there are a few people that regularly turn up and do it. No fuss. 

Chief Instructor

Once again the Training Officers at Henley have put in a mammoth effort to provide awards training for the 2006-07 season. Please refer to the awards list.

Paul Leonard commenced the season as Chief Instructor, but a change in his work circumstances has meant that I have had to take over the Chief Instructor's role once again.

We as a group very carefully plan how we approach awards training. There is always a structure in place to recruit new Training Officers as well as provide a wide variety of Award options for our members. All of this is based on sound logic. We want the best results for the club as a whole. This means that we try to target awards to the people that reciprocate by bringing their additional expertise to our patrols. Silver Medallion IRB Driver's award is a prime example of this. We also try to present the information in a way that is both informative and enjoyable. We make a big effort not to make it anymore difficult than it needs to be.

All of this does take a lot of time and it often looks like we live at the club (sometimes feels like that too!). The reason we do this job is because it is very rewarding and great fun.

When I took over from Paul in January, the vast bulk of the Chief Instructor's work had already been done. This included all of the proficiencies and Certificate II upgrades. With Leah Panakera-Thorpe's help, all I have had to do is coordinate the final Bronze group and make sure that communications and reporting are up to date.

The structure for training at Henley is now so well developed that everyone just gets on with it, very effectively.

Paul Leonard, Leah Panakera-Thorpe, Cec Owens, Shelby Miller, Nikki Bouveng, Carly Lutze, Amy Moore, Linda Willis, Steve Talbot, Andrew "Reggie" Lindsay and myself are the people who have taken part creating this effective and cohesive team. We have also always received the most committed support from our fellow club members and the Management Committee.

A point to be aware of is that each Training Officer and Assessor has to give up *days* of their own time simply to fulfill the qualification and proficiency requirements demanded by Surf Lifesaving. This is in addition to our training and proficiency commitments at the club, and our Assessor's duties for the State.

Training and assessment is undergoing significant change at the moment, as we (SLSA) pull ourselves into line as a Registered Training Organisation (RTO). The RTO status gives our awards a greater sphere of recognition, but the work our Training Officers have to do just to be qualified to train them has increased massively.

Finally, thank you to the Henley Trainers and well done to all of our award candidates. 129 in total since the end of last season shows a very healthy Lifesaving Club exists at Henley.

Max Domarecki and Caitlin Sheehy were selected in the State Junior Development Team, which was a great experience for them, although they did not get to travel interstate as the competition was in SA, I'm sure they still had a great time.

Once again, we had some outstanding results at Masters State Titles, with Andrew Lanyon excelling and Neville Fielder just behind him!. The girls had some bad luck in their Beach relay and the boys hand had an excellent run to win a Gold medal in the 140+ Beach Relay. Well done to all who competed on the weekend, especially Roy Menner who came away with 2 bronze medals from his first surf life saving competition.

We were represented in all areas at Senior State Titles, Boats, Boards, Ski, Water & Beach. Once again, the younger competitors are getting some great results, as well as the older competitors, with an outstanding effort from David "Fooz" Foureur to finish 3rd in the Open Single Ski race! At 43 years of age, which is a credit to his fitness and an inspiration to all members.

At the Surf Life Saving SA awards, I came 5th in the overall Women's championship, and Charlie Jarman, who competed at only one carnival, also finished 5th in the overall U17 Women's championship. It just goes to show how few female competitors there are in the U17 age group!

There is much more to Surf Life Saving competition than the usual carnivals and state titles, which include IRB racing, First Aid competition, R&R competition (which Henley won many titles in the old days), Champion Patrol, Champion Lifesaver, even Surfing (long and short board). All of these competitions are great for improving your skills as a lifesaver, which increases confidence when on patrol (or even when not on patrol), for when an emergency situation arises, you will be more confident to handle the situation.

Henley has a small group of competitors these days, most of which have been around for a long time. Carnivals this season saw very few of us attend, mainly due to the fact that most of them were down at Middleton, which makes it hard for the younger ones to get down there. The older competitors who have been around for years don't seem to be interested in giving up a whole day for a surf carnival for only a handful of events, or to sometime turn up only to find out there is no-one to compete against (which happened to me a couple of times this season!).

There are less and less people attending carnivals from all clubs, which is less than motivating for the ones who do go, who, in turn, don't bother next time. I think the state needs to bring in a rule that everyone must attend at least 2 or 3 carnivals during the season to be eligible for state titles. As there are so few competitors during the season at carnivals, come state titles where everyone shows up, they struggle to run an organised weekend and people can be sitting around for hours waiting for an event, then all of a sudden they've got two in a row!

Thanks once again to everyone who helped out with officiating, working party, water cover, IRB cover and patrol help at carnivals, state titles and interstate championships when our club was rostered. The names I can think of are Michael Domarecki, Jim Doherty, Trevor Mulvihill, Roy Menner, Tony Tammita, Andrew Hall, Paul Digger Martin, Aaron Lewis, John Foody, Chris Sheehy, and myself. I think there were a few I've missed, but it's always the same people year after year helping out.

I think this season's Aussie Titles team was the smallest in years, with our only competitors Andrew Lanyon and Sam Fielder, and officials Michael Domarecki and Trevor Mulvihill making the trip over to WA. Again, many people have mentioned they would like to go next year, so hopefully our touring team will be much bigger for 07-08 Aussies.

We need to look at introducing new members to the competition side of surf life saving, by including board, ski, boat and beach training sessions as part of their bronze medallion training. This will also help introduce the new members to existing members and make them feel welcome by the fact that they know more people.

Thanks to all the area captains for organising training for their respective areas, and also to those who ran training sessions on behalf of the area captains.

Board Area



Finance Report

The overall financial position of the club has been strengthened in the 2006-07 operating year.

The closing cash position for the Club as at 30 April 2007 was \$101,000 which included a balance in the operating account of \$33,000 and \$68,000 in the two investment accounts. The total figure recorded as at 30 April was well above the opening balance of \$55,000. This increase in the overall cash position is explained by two main reasons:

- · Improved operating outcome for the year, and
- the "Big Row" fundraising activity.

Capital Expenditure:

During the year the Club incurred expenditure on capital items (assets) totaling \$18,000. The item purchased included:

Defibrillator:	\$2,700
Competition Equipment (Boards)	\$3,500
Gym (Ergo) Equipment	\$3,300
Data Projector	\$2,500
Top Room Equipment	\$3,000

The equipment purchase decisions made during the year have taken into account the need to ensure that the core activities of the Club are supported. In addition the expenditure on items associated with the clubrooms, has been made on the basis that the assets acquired can be utilized in the long term.

As at 30 April the total book value of assets reported was \$533,000 consisting of the Building (\$420,500) and Plant & Equipment (\$112,500).

The overall operating profit generated from all activities for the year totaled \$51,142 from a turnover of \$138,400. (\$95,600 in 2005-06). This improved income figure has been the result of;

Strong Bar Trading	(\$18,900 surplus)
Grants, Sponsors and Fundraising	(\$31,500)
Big Row Donations	(\$40,000)
Membership / Levy contribution	(\$17,200)

These funds were used in a variety of outcomes including:

Lifesavings - administration, training and operations	(\$13,500)
General Operation	(\$ 9,000)
Building maintenance and operations	(\$12,800)
Juniors / Competition	(\$11,000)
Fundraising	(\$3,200)

It should be noted that during the year the Club booked accommodation for the National Competition in Perth. The cost of this (\$15,000) was recovered through the "selling off" of this accommodation to other clubs (\$12,500) with the balance used by club members.

The net operating result of the Club after taking in account depreciation on the assets held by the Club of \$17,198 was an Operating Profit of \$51,142. This was well above that achieved in the previous year (\$5,500).



With the improved operating result and the reduced expenditure level associated with capital items, the club has finished the 2007 year with a healthy cash balance. This outcome has been a focus for the Committee given the need to retain funds to ensure that the long term financial position of the Club is strong.

As Treasurer I am pleased to report that the committee works together to ensure that it has a strong focus of its financial stewardship role.

The Club has a number of challenges in front of it in the near future, not the least being the future funding requirement associated with the new building. As we embark on this major development the work undertaken during this last year to improve our financial position, has in my opinion provided a solid financial base for the club to move forward with this project.

I would particularly thank the "Big Row" team for the outstanding outcome achieved, Nikki, Michael and Barry (for operating the top room) and Neville and the Committee for their support in keeping the financial position of this Club strong.

The report is provided for the consideration of Members.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year Ended 30 April 2007

Note 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The Financial Report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard, other mandatory professional requirements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (South Australia).

The Financial Report covers Henley SLSC as an individual entity. Henley SLSC is an association incorporated in South Australia under the Associations Incorporations Act.

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account the changing values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless other wise stated.

Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997

Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value.

Property, Plant and Equipment

The value of the Club's Non-Current Assets are reviewed annually by the Management Committee and they are of the opinion that the book value, after allowance for the current year's depreciation charge, represents fairly their carrying values.



Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and at bank.

Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognized upon delivery of goods to customers. Interest Revenue is recognized on the basis of the interest rate applicable to the financial assets. Revenue from rendering of a service is recognized upon the delivery of a service to customers. All revenue is net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognized net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognized as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

All crews then waited for a big set and surfed the same wave back to shore.

What a fitting end for a great boatie. Thank you to the club members who were there to celebrate Tony's life and return his ashes to the sea.

His greatest achievement was as Treasurer of the Club during the period of serious fund-raising activities, including the well remembered 'Swing Shows' at the Tivoli, from 1947 to 1954. The main purpose of fund-raising at that time being the 'Building Fund'. George was one of those industrious and energetic members on Committee that prevailed and won the day during that period of the Club's history.

In 2003, somewhat belatedly, Tom Jennings and 'Chook' Fielder, knowing at first hand of George's endeavours for the Club, put the proposition to the 2003 AGM, that George King be conferred with Honorary Life Membership of the Club, which was approved. George moved away from Henley to Gawler and in 2005 returned to Largs Bay where he passed away in May of this year.
