# **President's Foreword**

The 2011/12 season – the Club's 87th year of operation has seen further strong growth in all areas.

Our membership has grown to well over 500 now with new members across all age groups which is very pleasing. Our finances are sound and we thank Mark Travers for his expertise and diligence in this area. Our major fundraiser — The West Beach Community Bank Big Row was another outstanding success in February raising \$68,535 toward the new Clubrooms.

Our Patrols performed admirably again this year with results still to be published in the State Patrol Efficiency Competition. Our Training team has again ensured another near record number of members have gained a variety of awards. Our Trainers spend much of their own time on top of their patrols etc ensuring the rest of us are skilled and upskilled in a range of First Aid and Life Saving disciplines and we thank them all for their huge efforts.

Our competition area had another successful year and there are several ongoing initiatives underway to ensure those members wishing to compete at a high level have every opportunity to do so with the appropriate support.

Many of our members travelled to Stansbury again to conduct the Beach Safety session for the Stansbury Primary School – an event that the children, teachers and parents all enjoy. Next year we hope that another Yorke Peninsular school can join us.

By the time you read this Annual Report our dear old Clubrooms have been removed from the landscape. It has been such a long and tiresome road and even when we have been on the cusp of commencement new hurdles have appeared. During May and June this year things came to a head and the fact we have now finally made a start is only due to the co-operation of Staff of The Minister for Emergency Services, Minister for the Environment, Minister for Infrastructure and Charles Sturt Council.

I wish to particularly thank our Local State Labor Member Paul Caica for his ongoing support, and Federal Labor Member Steve Georganas. If not for the assistance of Steve we would have lost the \$10,000 Federal Grant that will partly cover the cost of rainwater tanks and reticulation in the new building.

We must also thank Elaine Farmer and the Board of Management of Surf Life Saving SA who have agreed to act as Guarantor for our share of the cost of the building. This was a requirement put in place by Crown Law and without this Guarantee we could not have proceeded.

Your Committee has been very conservative in the financial commitments we have entered and we are confident that we can comfortably afford the loan repayments, the running costs of the new building and of course the cost of putting our patrols on the beach. But we need to continue to be prudent in all areas and continue to support our ongoing fundraising efforts. The **Foundation Fifty** fundraising initiative is almost fully subscribed, raising \$80,000 of the \$100,000 target and we thank Joe Bayer for putting this initiative together.

This year I was delighted to award The President's Trophy to Jane Dewar in acknowledgement of her continuing behind the scenes efforts in managing and administering the Big Row and support of the Committee in general. It was Jane's initiative to create the Henley Challenge concept which raised \$5,000 toward the new Clubrooms (and we hope this initiative will grow in the coming years).

Once again, a huge thank you to our volunteer members, families, friends and supporters for their efforts in ensuring that our Club remains respected, successful and an enjoyable place to be.

# **Club Captain**

At the end of another successful season it would be remiss to not reflect on what we've achieved but also to understand where we have room for improvement.

Patrol services have been and will remain Henley's priority and focus, as without these we would not exist as a club. It has therefore been encouraging to see our assiduous training team bring almost 60 new members into our patrolling group this season. Even though we now have a larger pool of members to fill our patrols, we must all remain diligent and dedicated to our own patrol commitments, and not rely on others to pick up our slack. The number of instances of people failing to attend their patrols is slowly on the rise and to ensure we nip this in the bud, next season there will be a focus on enforcing our already existing processes and policies around patrol attendance and penalty patrols.

I do not wish to detract from the huge commitment and effort that our members have made this season. Collectively, Henley members have accumulated over 5,030 hours patrolling for surf clubs and state services (e.g. rescue helicopter, jet boat, jet skis, 'SurfCom' radio room) in the 2011/12 season which is a tremendous amount of their time to volunteer.

In the past Henley has struggled to encourage its Junior members to progress into the Senior competition area; over the past few years, however, there's been a resurgence of the Juniors competitively which is certainly pushing the club to ensure that there is a structured and welcoming competition area to support this progression. Along with this growth we will find ourselves in need of more coaches and officials and so encourage everyone to take up these opportunities when offered.

I am once again amazed by the willingness of Henley members to volunteer and assist around the club wherever they may be needed. As Club Captain I frequently feel that I am constantly asking for a lot from our members (whether that be filling in for a last minute patrol, running some extra training, preparing some documentation or even just cleaning the club rooms) and am continuously astounded and made proud when the answer is always an unreserved "yes" or "no problems". It's this committed and selfless nature of our members that makes Henley such a great club and thank everyone who has contributed to this.

I'd also like to take a moment to particularly recognise and thank Shelly Nelson who has covered a myriad of roles within the club this season (often without choice or purely because there was no one else to do so) and has done so conscientiously, autonomously and without reward or recognition. I have no doubt that we would not have had such a successful season if it wasn't for the contributions made by Shelly in so many different aspects of our club.

We are now faced with the challenge of maintaining this high standard that Henley has built but without our club rooms for support and communication and ask that, now more than ever, we all work together to continue the Henley enthusiasm and quality.

# **Vice Captains Report**

Firstly, I would like to mention how refreshing it was to have so many patrolling members this season. We had 11 patrolling groups and next season it looks like we could have at least two more.

I would like to thank our Patrol Captains for the season. George Symeonakis, Shannon Asa, Bianca Parker, Sean Flectcher, Phil Hogan, Tom Lanyon, Tony Tammita, Aaron Lewis and Hannah Foody.

A special mention to our two youngest patrol captains - Bianca Parker and Jake Fitzgerald. I hope these two members keep developing their leadership skills because I anticipate you will be part of the bigger picture in the future.

People's attendances at patrols this season were varied. Next season the committee has decided to restructure the penalty system for not attending patrols. If, you don't attend your patrol with no sub you will get a penalty patrol. If, you miss another patrol with no sub you will be asked to explain personally your actions to the management committee. This will ensure Henley continues to serve the community with vigilance.

A special mention to one of our youngest patrolling members. Maddie Howard had 100% attendances for the season. Thank you for leading the way.

A few examples of Henley's service and vigilance this season

Patient was identified as being in distress on the Northern side of the Jetty. Hannah Sitters and Paul Leonard performed an extremely effective IRB retrieval.

The rest of RED patrol worked as a team to ensure that Oxygen, Defib, communications and ongoing patrol was maintained. The patient was in mild to moderate respiratory distress that failed to improve with oxygen. An ambulance crew attended the scene and eventually discharged the patient into the care of his friends. There was no doubt that without rapid identification of the patient's condition and an efficient rescue and resuscitation, the outcome for the patient would have been grave.

Three things were identified from this incident:

- 1. Our patrol members all exhibit outstanding skills and professionalism in performing rescues.
- 2. The Northern end of the Jetty is a major problem area for inexperienced swimmers, and,
- 3. Jack Mather is a very handy nipper to have around as it was Jack who identified the swimmer in distress and alerted the patrol. Well done to all involved.

Our community swims were conducted brilliantly and the absence of rescues and/or incident is a reflection on how well organised these events were. Sean Fletcher did a particularly high-quality job on Australia Day. I would also like to acknowledge Tony Tammita's commitment to supporting these events and showing ongoing leadership in the water. The patrolling members who did extra patrols for these events showed dedication and commitment in supporting our vision to grow and develop as a club.

A small anecdote of commitment - Tim Cavanagh's wife was competing at Master States and we were finding it difficult to find a few more people to do an extra patrol. Tim stepped up to the plate even though he had other commitments he found time to help the club and his community.

The Bunning's BBQ's have been a great fundraiser. Around \$4,500 was raised over 5 days.

Tom Jennings – a massive thank you for helping every day. Your support made my job a lot easier.



There have also been many achievements through many interstate trip and selected state team crews. We thank all the sweeps, competitors and club members who are involved in the surfboat area as there is a booming social aspect and very good competition opportunities which we look forward to maintaining and further succeeding on again next year.

When I was entering this year's senior and master state titles entries I was very impressed with number of competitors Henley was able to produce. In state titles we had a number of competitors across all areas and placing average of 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> place and a few medals being won in all areas expect surf boats. In the surf boat area Henley has stepped up from last year as previously mentioned having a crew in each age category. Henley placed overall 11<sup>th</sup> place in state titles this year with a point score of 113. We aim for next year that we can move Henley slowly up the ladder and place 10<sup>th</sup> or under. In the masters area I was rapt when I arrived at the state titles to see a big tent of Henley masters all on the beach wearing the blue and white colours of Henley. A very great effort for everyone who competed and to all those who gave new events a go this year, we had many new faces which we hope to see out again next year.

The Aussie titles this year had an amazing number of Henley competitors both master and senior to a total of 23 and we are proud of all those who competed this year.

Special mention must go to Rick Daley who won an Australian Titles Silver Medal in the 1km beach run in the 65-69 years division. Congratulations Rick – what a fantastic achievement.



As a club growing with competition we need to be aware that we are required to supply officials on behalf of the club. Especially if our number continues to grow at the Aussie next year we will need to supply a qualified IRB driver and official who are available for the week. Please keep this in mind if you are not interested in competing but have a love for surf sports or feel like further expanding your qualification Henley is always seeking more officials in the senior and master divisions.

I would like to thank all those who competed in surf sports this season for Henley, and especially all the trainer and area captains who have put in the effort to keep the surf sports culture alive in our club. I would personally like to say I am very proud of all those who have been competing for Henley and those who have put in the effort to maintain and strengthen our competition areas; we will slowly get there for all areas like we can see in the boat area.

I welcome any one who is interested in any sports at any level and with little or no experience. I would encourage everyone this coming season to give each area a go as it is a great way to meet new people and share in new experiences.

I would also like to give a huge thankyou to Tom Lanyon who has helped me this season with many of the entries and organizing of surf sports. The last two years has been a great learning experience as the youngest member on the management committee and in this leadership role in the club. I would like to thank everyone who has helped support me along the way and guided me in my role.

I hope the competition at Henley can stay and grow stronger and we can evolve to be a big surf sport s club with each category of the surf sports filled in the coming years. For all you senior and master competitors, keep up the good work, your efforts do not go unnoticed. Keep encouraging everyone to try something new and I wish you good luck in your training and competition for the upcoming 2012/2013 season.

Finally, to all the younger members of our club coming up from nippers or who are new I welcome you into the senior competition area and wish you the best for next season as I know we have some amazing talent and it is now your time to shine.

# **Surf Boat Area**

Every season since setting a SMARTTA goal setting plan we have stepped up all facets of our surf boat operations from recruiting, strength and condition coaching and performance goals at local and interstate competition. The boat panel is on track with our members' commitment to reaching our five year plan.

The Henley crews had an early preparation in 2012 with planned sessions in the gym over winter. This was evident at the opening competition in the Port River challenge on the  $9^{th}$  of October. The crews were competitive at all levels of competition.

The focus for the first three carnivals was to win the Navy Cup series of carnivals. The ASRLSA for the first time held a carnival at Robe in December at 12 Mile Beach. This is a fantastic venue for boat carnivals and we look forward to visiting this great beach again. The local sports clubs catered a dinner for all SA clubbies on the Saturday night. ## The West Beach Community Bank Big Row 2012

The West Beach Community Bank Big Row was again a huge success in 2012 with this year's event raising \$67,535 bringing the total to over \$310,000 raised to date.

Following last years terrible weather, this year's Big Row event was fortunate to have perfect conditions. The 68km Gulf crossing took approximately 8 hours, with the 5 participating crews each rowing their stints and we had many new members take part in this year's crossing.

The Big Row finishing crew arrived at Henley Beach at 2pm and were escorted in by members on boards under a veil of water provided by the MFS Fire Boat 'The Gallantry', which provided quite a spectacle for the enthusiastic juniors, spectators and media waiting on the beach. It was encouraging to again receive fantastic coverage on the nightly news, including extensive coverage on Channel 9 and 7 as well as articles in the Messenger.

## All money raised by the Big Row is contributing toward the redevelopment of our new club rooms.

As with previous years, a key part of the Big Row event involved Henley members, led by Phil Hogan, Barrie Cole and Andrew Henry conducting a Nippers session for the students of Stansbury Primary School. In addition to the regular program, year's 6 and 7 students were also trained and assessed to gain their Resuscitation Certificates, an essential life saving skill, especially as there are no Surf Life Saving Clubs on Yorke Peninsula.

The Big Row would not have been possible without the generous support from John Butterfield, Kevin Renfrey, Rod "Rocket" McFarlane and Robert Gerard who donated their boats to support the crossing.



I would also like to thank and acknowledge the extensive behind the scenes support provided the Big Row organizing committee, as well as from our helpers Rae Lawson, Kathryn Curnow Sue Fitzgerald, Alison Sim and Karen "Kasbah" Lewis.

The Big Row boat was welcomed back to Henley in an incredible show of support by our members. One of our sponsors remarked to me, "I knew it was called the Big Row – but I didn't realize it was this BIG!!!". He was commenting on the fantastic and loud welcome home given to the finishing crew by our juniors, our members and supporters as well as the huge media turn out with tv crews and helicopters present.

## **Finance Report**

The overall financial position of the club has continued to be maintained in the 2011-12 operating year.

The closing cash position for the Club as at 30 April 2012 was \$314,874 which included a balance in the operating account of \$20,098 and \$286,783 in the other investment accounts maintained by the club. The total figure recorded as at 30 April was above the opening balance of \$137,086. This increase in the overall cash position is explained by the following main reasons:

- the overall trading profit achieved and increased membership income,
- the impact of the Big Row fundraiser, and

Capital costs associated with the new Building

• the impact of other fundraising conducted during the year including The Foundation 50 initiative and the donation made by Bendigo Bank Community Enterprise in conjunction with Adelaide Shores, which was then matched by West Beach Community Bank.

## Capital Expenditure:

During the year the Club incurred expenditure on capital items (assets) totaling \$21,343 (\$69,370 in 2010/11). The items purchased included:

capital costs associated with the new building	\$11,514
New Equipment:	
Plant and Equipment	\$2,249
Competition Equipment (Boards)	\$5,409
Surf Boat Equipment	\$2,171

The equipment purchase decisions made during the year have taken into account the need to ensure that the core activities of the Club are supported. It should be noted that to some extent the equipment purchases made have been directly offset by various grants and sponsorships received during the year. This initiative is being actively pursued to ensure that the Club can leverage direct sponsorship arrangements against equipment replacement requirements.

As at 30 April 2012 the total book value of assets reported was \$570,023 consisting of the Building (\$412,970) and Plant and Equipment (\$157,053). Noting that an amount of \$200,000 has been written off the cost base for the old building to recognize the decommissioning of the building.

Operating income for the year was \$325,338 was above the \$182,198 received in 2010-11. The result is largely explained by:

- Strong overall Trading outcome (\$66,582)
- Grants, Sponsors and Fundraising (\$204,048)
- Membership / Levy contribution (\$48,270)
- Sundry and Other Income (\$6,438)

It is noted that the membership figure includes the Building Fund Levy which amounted to a figure of \$9,500 in 2011-12 (total collected equates to \$39,700) and the Competition Levy which equated to a figure of \$4,725 in 2011-12.

These funds were used in a variety of outcomes including:

- Lifesavings administration, training and operations (\$40,287)
- General Operation (\$15,301)
- Building maintenance and operations (\$33,803)



The net operating result of the Club for 2011-12 was \$190,508. This result is reduced after taking in account depreciation on the assets held by the Club and the write-down of the building of \$220,999 to a final operating result (loss) of (\$30,491). This result was less than that achieved in the previous year of \$55,078, however it is largely the result of the write off of the existing building taken through the accounts.

Included within this result was the trading account (Bar and Clothing) result of a Gross Profit of \$21,143. This result is in the same order as that recorded in 2010-11 of \$29,667.

The retention of a strong cash position has been a focus for the Committee given the need to retain funds to ensure that the long term financial position of the Club is strong and the committee has worked diligently towards this objective.

The Committee has continued to review capital expenditure in line with the endorsed 5 year capital plan to ensure that the Club's equipment is maintained at an appropriate level and to also keep up with the demand given the increasingly strong membership base. The building project will also add financial pressures both during the construction phase and then in relation to the need to service and repay the additional borrowing required as a result of the project.

Income from club activities to support the funding requirements of the Club is derived from 4 key areas:

- Membership 15% (22% in 2010-11)
- Trading Activities 20% (32% in 2010-11)
- Grants and Fundraising 63% (36% in 2010-11)
- Other 2% (10% in 2010-11)

As indicated above the strong membership base of the Club continues to provide a strong financial base to support the ongoing operations of the club.

The Big Row continues to be the key fundraising initiative for the Club. Sponsorships are also an important fundraising component and all sponsors should be congratulated for their invaluable and generous support of the Club. Grants made available by the City of Charles Sturt, State Government and Federal Government are also critical.


Those members who put in an enormous amount of time on the Grant applications, organizing the Big Row and raising funds through the BBQ on Saturdays, Bunning BBQ and events such as the phone book deliveries all should be congratulated – without your time, effort and in some cases contacts, the Clubs' financial position would not be as strong as it is. Well done!

All these areas need to remain a strong focus for the Committee in coming years and that continued support from members will be required.

The Club has over the past several years continued to maintain a solid financial base to enable it to move forward with the building project. Whilst we are all please with the progress now made – the financial commitment required to get the project across the line comes with increased financial responsibility – the on-going support of all Members will be essential in maintaining our strong financial position moving forward.

# Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 30 April 2012

### Note 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The Financial Report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard, other mandatory professional requirements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (South Australia).

The Financial Report covers Henley SLSC as an individual entity. Henley SLSC is an association incorporated in South Australia under the Associations Incorporations Act.

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account the changing values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless other wise stated.

#### (A) INCOME TAX

The Association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997

#### (B) INVENTORIES

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value.

## (C) PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

The value of the Club's Non-Current Assets is reviewed annually by the Management Committee and they are of the opinion that the book value, after allowance for the current year's depreciation charge, represents fairly their carrying values.

## (D) CASH

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and at bank.

### (E) REVENUE

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognized upon delivery of goods to customers.

Interest Revenue is recognized on the basis of the interest rate applicable to the financial assets. Revenue from rendering of a service is recognized upon the delivery of a service to customers. All revenue is net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### (F) GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognized net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognized as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

# Auditor's Report To the Members of Henley Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

#### SCOPE

I have audited the financial report being the Statement of Financial Performance, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Cash Flows, Notes to the Financial Statements and the Statement by members of the Committee of Henley Surf Life Saving Club Inc. set out on pages 42 to 46 for the year ended 30 April 2012.

The Committee is responsible for the financial report. I have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members of the Club.

My audit has been conducted in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. My procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Club's financial position, the results of its operations and cash flows.

The audit opinion expressed has been formed on the above basis.

#### QUALIFICATION

Given the nature of the operations of the Henley Surf Life Saving Club inc. it is not practicable to establish accounting controls over all amounts receivable prior to the issue of a cash receipt and therefore it is not possible to know whether all income due to the Club has been received by the Club and recorded in the books of account.

Accordingly, my audit has been limited to the amounts of cash receipts recorded in the books of account of the Club.

### **AUDIT OPINION**



It took just 3 years to achieve this goal and so he continued door knocking, eventually raising enough money to purchase 2 jet boats, and 2 four wheel drives for the Association.

After having then supplied each of the eighteen SA lifesaving club with a racing ski and several nipper boards he took on projects for individual clubs. In the case of Henley, Sid raised enough money to completely fit out our first aid room with the necessary fittings and first aid equipment.




## VALE GEOFFREY ARNOLD BULL "BULLY" Life Member

Geoff Bull (Bully) a Henley life member passed away on 16th of June 2012. Bully was always a gentleman, a man of great strength, few words and a very dry sense of humour.

He had been a member of the Henley and Grange swimming club and competed in water polo and many long swims including Port Pirie, Port Wakefield, Port Adelaide Rosewater and the Henley to Grange swim.

He was also a keen water polo team and was the goalie of the B grade premiership team in 54/55 and the team that won the A grade in 58/59. I was told that in one of those games with seconds to go he threw the winning goal from his goal through the goal at the other end.



He joined our club and gained his bronze in March 1959. Possom Baker was also in that squad. Despite his swimming ability Bully joined the boat crews and was rewarded with his first open boat surf boat title in 68/69.

The club won two more state tiles with Geoff in the team and they were chosen as the state team crew for Blacksmiths NSW and Burleigh Heads Queensland in 1973. In the following year 1974 at Glenelg, a composite crew was chosen and Geoff was picked as the bowman. Bully was a natural bowman because of his strength he could always jump into the boat at starts whether the water was so deep that the gunwhale was above his head or being knocked by a large wave.

In the 71/72 season Henley borrowed a boat from Moana, as Henley's boat was so old and heavy. Bully;s crew made it through to the semi finals at the Aussies in the opens. The crew was coming clear second and whilst rowing for a wave a crew member fell out of his seat and they slipped of the wave and were brought back with the rest of the field and finished fourth in a very close finish, just missing out on making the finals.

The crew wanted a new boat to remain successful and the club said "raise the money". Bully had seen beer tickets being sold in the front bar of a pub in the hills and brought some back and urged us to make them up and introduce them firstly into the Ramsgate and then the Henley South. They were so popular some nights up to 7 series were sold on a Friday night. Many from the club joined in the folding and stapling of the tickets after training, we got a new boat and the club had \$71,000 in the bank.

Bully because of his trade and welding skills kept the boats and trailers in top condition and was always helping with other repairs around the club.

Geoff was made a life member in 1980 and a surf boat was named in his honour in 1997. He has shipped oars for the last time and will always be remembered by those that swam, rowed and socialised with him. RIP Bully






