CLUB CAPTAIN REPORT

Congratulations to all our patrolling members for another successful and safe season. During the season we patrolled for 3936 hours. This includes patrol hours and water cover hours. I would like to thank the Operations Committee for their work and support during the season.

Our lifesaving equipment is in the best shape it has been for many seasons. We now have 3 IRB hulls and motors in very good condition. Two old hulls, the Johnson eTec motor, old compressor and the old beach dolly were sold. With the help of Grants, we were able to purchase a new beach dolly for our IRB. We also purchased the following lifesaving equipment:

- Mercury IRB motor to replace the Johnson eTec motor
- 3 inhale oxygen resus kits. These kits require no maintenance. Once the bottle is empty, the bottle and built in regulator are replaced.
- 3 lockable cages to store equipment for Snippers, HET and Lifesaving.
- Training manikins
- Defib for patrols. All patrol defibs are now the same.
- New compressor for inflating IRB hulls. A big thank you to Tim Cavanagh for installing this.
- New hoses for cleaning equipment.
- New PFD's.
- 2 new rescue boards, flippers, new radio covers
- Extra digital radio for patrols
- Cupboard for storing tools and other main tenance equipment

On the drawing board is a hoist to store one of the IRB hulls on the roof.

A huge thankyou to all our members that volunteer their time to do patrols, water safety, sit on committees and help in any way possible. Your help and dedication is invaluable. Without you, this club could not exist. Keep up the great work. Looking forward to season 2022.




GYM COORDINATOR REPORT





YOUTH COORDINATOR REPORT

Season 2021/2022 was a challenging year with Covid restrictions, which saw myself, Michelle and Jamie in isolation during the season, as well as being new into this role of Youth Coordinator.

The focus of HET / Youth is to provide a pathway from Juniors to Seniors and retain members through this high drop of period. This situation is experienced by all surf clubs Australia wide. Also focusing on development of surf lifesaving skills and socialization.

Over the past 2 years we have managed to update or IRB's and their motors so that we now have 3 IRB's each with the same motor and 1 new road trailer and 1 new beach trailer. We have updated oxygen cylinders and bags with new advanced resuscitation equipment. There is also a new storage cabinet for fuels and flammables.

All Bronze members will have received new patrol shirts with the in-kind funding from Surf Life Saving Australia.

The ORS Grant for youth engagement was used to purchase 2 x fibreglass Nipper boards.

The COVID Support Grant assisted during the restricted trading during what would have normally been our busiest period for the bistro.

Finance Report

The 2020-21 Financial Report incorporates a 12 month period form 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022.

The financial position of the club has been challenged during the 2021-22 year. There has been the big challenge of COVID-19 trading restriction without the support of Jobkeeper and other COVID relief payments that were available in the 2020-21 year. These challenges have impacted hospitality and sporting organisations across the State and across Australia. The challenges are real and have had a deep impact for us and we must now look forward and work towards a better result in 2022-23.

The closing cash position for the Club as at 30 June was \$68,705, a decrease of \$66,165 from our opening balance of \$134,870.

We still managed to purchase new assets this year with spending on new items of \$71,295. We continue to replace old, outdated or damaged equipment through grant applications, sponsorships, donations and fundraising.

These purchases have to some extent been directly offset by various grants and sponsorships received during the year in addition to the application of the equipment funding levy. Seeking specific direct sponsorship for equipment continues to be actively pursued to ensure that the Club can continue to support equipment requirements into the future.

The total income received in 2021-22 of \$980,791 was derived from the following key areas;

Income is down due to government-imposed restrictions on our trading and the removal of government COVID-19 support funding.

As our building ages, we are going to see increased call on our cash to repair and maintain the building and its contents.

Much of our lifesaving assets have been replaced or updated, and we find ourselves in the great position of having 3 IRB's and motors, all in very good condition, a new ATV, some new rescue boards, new training equipment and new resuscitation equipment, along with new storage cabinet and cages, hoses, compressor and lifejackets etc. There has also been some new sporting equipment with Nipper boards and a youth double ski. It is great to have been able to continue with upgrading of equipment during these tough times. This cannot be achieved without fundraising, successful grant applications, donations, sponsorships and the support of the members.

Club membership provides a strong financial base to support the ongoing operations of the club and therefore it is imperative that focus is given to member retention and sustainable member growth.

Notes to the Financial Statements
For the year ended 30 June 2022

Note 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The Financial Report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard, other mandatory professional requirements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (South Australia).

The Financial Report covers Henley SLSC as an individual entity. Henley SLSC is an association incorporated in South Australia under the Associations Incorporations Act.

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account the changing values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(A) INCOME TAX

The Association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997

(B) INVENTORIES

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(C) PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

The value of the Club’s Non-Current Assets is reviewed annually by the Board of Management and they are of the opinion that the book value, after allowance for the current year’s depreciation charge, represents fairly their carrying values.

(D) CASH

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and at bank.

(E) REVENUE

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon delivery of goods to customers.

Interest Revenue is recognized on the basis of the interest rate applicable to the financial assets. Revenue from rendering of a service is recognized upon the delivery of a service to customers. All revenue is net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(F) GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognized net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognized as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.
