President's Foreword

The 2008/09 season, our 84th saw a near record 43 rescues at Henley with no loss of life during our hours of operation, proving the skills of our volunteer members who handled several emergency situations calmly and professionally. Membership numbers have increased further to around 360, with a healthy balance of new members and youngsters progressing from Nippers through to the senior ranks.

Our financial standing has improved yet again, mainly through the outstanding efforts of Sue Fitzgerald in running the Top Room, and a hugely successful third Big Row that brought in over \$50,000. this year.

In my last report I predicted that our new Clubrooms would commence in late 2008 – wrong again unfortunately but I can report that by the time you read this page our Development Application will have been lodged and State Cabinet will have considered the submission by the South Australian Fire and Emergency Services Commission.

We have directly lobbied The Minister for Emergency Services, The Minister for the Environment and Conservation, and The Minister for Urban Development and Planning to ensure they understand the importance of the project and that their respective departments are supportive. Each of these key Ministers has expressed their wish for the project to proceed as quickly as possible. Council's staff representatives are also most supportive of the concept design.

Given our desire to provide our volunteer members with the best facilities possible, the task of balancing a practical building with a design that suits the location has been difficult and compounded by quite dramatic price fluctuations during the past year. The design is modern and sympathetic to the local environment. Expected commencement date is late August 2009 with an estimated construction period of 10 months.

I again especially thank our local State Member Paul Caica, along with Councillors Jim Fitzpatrick, Anna Rau and Paul Sykes for their ongoing support with the project, together with our Building Committee of Joe Bayer, Phil Hogan, Matt Simone and Aaron Lewis.

I briefly mentioned the third West Beach Community Bank Big Row earlier. Despite the World Financial Crisis we well and truly exceeded our expectations by raising over \$50,000 from this year's event. Congratulations to all involved and particularly Jane Dewar, Lisa Will, Katheryn Curnow and Lynne Tammitta for their expert (and tough) administration and coordination of the event.

We have definitely earned great respect from the Stansbury Community for our Beach Safety sessions with the local Primary School and will in future continue to make that a permanent part of the weekend. Our sincere thanks again to Mr Robert Gerard AO John Butterfield and Kevin Renfrey for their generosity in providing their boats for two days in support of the event.

I was recently elected to the City of Charles Sturt's Community Coastal Reference Group as the representative for Community Services groups. The aim of the group is to provide a conduit between the Community and Council for issues that affect the coast and environs. Issues I have raised to date are the deliberate pumping of polluted road grime into the sea; non policing of beachside Dry Zones and associated bad behaviour; and non policing of littering laws.

Each of these issues affect the quality and amenity of the marine environment and our beaches – our other back yard and we hope to achieve improvement in the short term.

In closing I again thank our volunteer members, families, friends and supporters for their ongoing efforts in keeping this iconic Club so successful and vibrant. The next twelve months will be even more exciting than the last.



Club Captain

In order for our club to function there are many people who work tirelessly behind the scenes devoting their time, energy and expertise towards ensuring that we are able to operate successfully. In some areas we perform very well and in others we need to find way to improve how we perform. To that end, it is vital that we constantly evaluate our performance in all areas and strive to improve. The Henley SLSC is not a building, nor is it a stock of material resources and equipment. Our club is made up of each and every individual member. We are an organization of people, and it is our people that are our greatest assets. Not everyone is able to contribute at the same level, but each and every member does have something to offer. Whether the contribution is large or small, it is important and vital.

Looking into the future, we are entering a new phase of our club's lifecycle. There will be a year of hardship and inconvenience during our redevelopment program. It will mean that money is tight, and our opportunities to socialise together as "clubbies" will be limited. Following this, there will be a period of rapid growth and change as we adapt to our new circumstances. To facilitate this we will need our members to once again dig deeply into their store of altruism and take on roles either large or small to ensure that our club, our culture and our reputation are nurtured and grown in a way that retains all of the characteristics that makes our club (our people) such a rewarding organization to be a part of.

During our rebuilding phase, we will endeavour to provide opportunities to get together as fellow members. This will be harder without our own "home" but essential to ensure that we remain strong into the growth phase that will follow.

The Management Committee has a difficult role at the best of times. Members of the committee have to accept accountability for their area. This often means that we are answerable on a personal level to our members, and often accept personal legal and moral responsibility for our clubs interaction with the community. At times this means that we must make unpopular decisions. Occasionally, we are asked to perform unpleasant duties. No one tries to find dramas, nor does any one of us enjoy occasionally having to make the "tough choice". What we all have in common is our desire to always try and do what is in the best interests of every individual member and our club as a whole. It is impossible to please 100% of people 100% of the time; so instead, we agonise over the difficult decisions and do our best to serve our members in the best way possible.

I would like to acknowledge certain areas of our clubs operations.

Our Trainers and Lifesaving Officers have to put in a lot of work behind the scenes in order to comply with rapidly changing rules and regulations. In addition to the hands on duties, there are many hours spent on computers performing administrative tasks and ensuring that our qualifications remain current. In addition to our Trainers and Lifesaving Committee, many other hard workers perform the tedious jobs to ensure that our club keeps running. Spare a moment to consider these people, without whom we simply could not operate.

A major project for next season is to expand our activities in Surf Lifesaving competition. There is a camaraderie that flows from competition experience that is an important aspect of our club life. Also, there is a need to provide the means for any member that wishes to compete to reach their highest potential. Whilst easy access to training equipment and facilities may be compromised during our redevelopment process, the benefits of not delaying this activity will make the extra work worthwhile. What doesn't kill us makes us stronger!

My highlight for the season came on Australia Day. Instead of driving an IRB for the long swim, I was on the balcony with binoculars and a radio (and my arm in that damn sling). What I saw was nearly 60 Henley members on boards, skis, boats, IRBs (3) and in the water with rescue tubes. Our Rhino was moving up and down the beach. We had a patrol set up in front of the club (from 8am). We had a first aid station and outpost just North of the jetty and we had roving patrols and jetty outposts. Every part of the club was represented. On our most important National Day, we showed why the Henley SLSC is a fair representation of one of our most iconic national organizations.



My observations of our club over the last season have been extremely positive. There is a great connection between old and new. Our Life Members continue to contribute at a level that earned them their prestigious award. Without their experience and guardianship of our culture, we would all be worse off. Our young members also give me great hope for the future of our club. It is particularly satisfying to see them remain committed and enthusiastic about their role within our club. Their humour, energy and maturity beyond their years add much to the ambience of the club. I'm looking forward to watching these terrific young adults becoming the backbone of our club for many years to come.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone that helped me during the time I was incapacitated. 7 weeks with my arm in a sling was personally frustrating as it severely limited what I was able to do. Willing helpers and constant words of caution ("don't do that Tony!"), have made a difficult situation a lot easier, and ensured that I stuck to my rehab properly.

Next season isn't far away and there is much to do in preparation for the next phase of our clubs ongoing development. I know that with the commitment and enthusiasm of our current members, we can approach this next phase with quiet confidence.

PATROL SUMMARY

This has been an extremely busy year for Henley SLSC patrol services. It has been made possible by the dedication of our patrolling members.

40 lives were saved and many more incidents were prevented by the diligence and professionalism of our patrol services.

Our Patrol Captains recorded detailed information including our numbers of roving patrols and outposts as well as the routine reports of rescues, first aids and preventions. Surf Lifesaving quizzes and rescue scenario practice were also a mandatory part of our patrol duties.

These were done to ensure that we maintained the highest possible level of lifesaving cover from Reedie St to The Outlet and all members were trained to the highest possible level of competence.

Much effort from the Lifesaving Area officers ensured that we had properly functioning and adequate equipment to perform our duties.

In addition to our 48 rostered patrols, Henley SLSC provided an additional 24 "Unrostered Patrols" to cover busy times during hot weather and community events. Our statistics for the season clearly demonstrate how much we have managed to achieve during 2008-9.

As a club we finished the season with 174 people contributing patrol services to Henley SLSC. This worked out as an average of 29 hours per member. Of the 174 members, 32 members were not available to patrol for the entire season, mainly because they either left the club early in the season or gained their awards mid or late in the season. This means that our average per member for all members that started and finished the entire season was 33.5 hours. Most importantly, we started the season with 150 members on our roster and finished with 165.

It is simply not possible to individually name all of our outstanding patrol contributors, although individual letters have gone to all patrol members expressing appreciation for their efforts. As a whole club, we should be very proud of our service to our community. I hope that we can continue to perform at this level well into the foreseeable future.

The patrol hours sheet statistics highlight just how much extra we have done over the season.


Chief Instructor

IRB Area

This past season saw the club's Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) crews have a very demanding year.

With the large number of shark sightings in the Henley and Grange areas during November, December and January, crews were called regularly outside **normal** patrol duties. They responded quickly and were able to ensure the public safety. Extra patrols were also scheduled during the long heat wave putting a strain on club resources. With the club now able to provide three fully equipped IRB, we were able to provide a high level of water cover for beach users in the Henley to Grange area. This was adamant on a Saturday during nipper training. It had been reported a member of the public was seen going under near the Torrens Outlet. Within minutes we were able to provide two IRBs to assist JRBs, Westpac One and West Beach SLSC in the search, leaving an IRB to provide water cover for junior activities. Fortunately the swimmer was found safe and well.

Unfortunately with the lack of space in the club rooms at times we can only have one fully equipped IRB on standby on the trailer with the All Terrain Vehicle (ATV) for an instant response. Other boats maybe required to be assembled creating a delay in providing extra assistance. Hopefully with the prospective new clubroom we will have enough space to improve our response time for responding with multiple IRBs.

I would like to thank Telstra and Yamaha in proving financial assistance. Also I would like thank Outboard Motors Service for servicing our motors promptly.

Without the assistance of dedicated members it would have been difficult to maintain an efficient service. 






The 2008/2009 season provided us with some fantastic opportunities to apply for, and be awarded grants.

The highlight being the Clubs SA grant – with Henley SLSC being awarded a **record breaking \$25,300 grant** from Clubs SA to completely refurbish and refit our gymnasium. As part of this grant application, Clubs SA were included as major sponsors of the Big Row to increase their profile.

Clubs SA is the official industry body representing the interests of licensed clubs in this state. Its major platform has been to effect changes to government legislation to enable Clubs to become more self sufficient over the long term, and to also provide a recognised infrastructure for the active support and promotion of sport and community events across the Club industry.

A huge thank you to Clubs SA for their support.

The club has also received grants from

Active Clubs Grant from the Office of Recreation and Sport - \$4,300 to purchase new Nipper Boards for the juniors.

Australian Sports Commission — Local Sporting Heros Program - \$3,300 – which supported the Under 19 boat crew to travel and compete at the Australian Titles.

Finance Report

The overall financial position of the club has been maintained, if not to some degree strengthened, in the 2008-09 operating year.

The closing cash position for the Club as at 30 April 2009 was \$101,142 which included a balance in the operating account of \$33,789 (consisting of an operating balance of \$18,839 associated with the trading account and a balance of \$14,950 associated with the Building Levy raised to date) and \$67,278 in the two investment accounts. The total figure recorded as at 30 April was above the opening balance of \$97,299. This increase in the overall cash position is explained by two main reasons:

- Improved trading results achieved for the year, and
- ♦ The continued impact and importance for the Big Row, and
- Use of grants funding for capital expenditure.

It should also be noted that the Club signed a reimbursement deed with the City of Charles Sturt late in the financial year and as at balance date an amount of \$50,000 had been claimed but not paid. This amount was reimbursed in May/ June and effectively increases the cash balance to an amount in the order of \$150,000.

Capital Expenditure:

During the year the Club incurred expenditure on capital items (assets) totaling \$73,261. The item purchased included:

The equipment purchase decisions made during the year have taken into account the need to ensure that the core activities of the Club are supported. The ability to secure additional grant funding to upgrade Gym Equipment was very much appreciated and reflects the great effort of club members in applying for such grants.

As at 30 April 2009 the total book value of assets reported was \$641,816 consisting of the Building (\$497,224) and Plant & Equipment (\$144,592).

Operating income for the year was \$205,563 (\$186,259 in 2007-08) and was the result of;

- Strong overall Trading outcome (\$55,716)
- Grants, Sponsors and Fundraising (\$63,521)
- ♦ Big Row Donations (\$44,648)
- Membership / Levy contribution (\$28,940)
- Sundry and Other Income (\$12,738)

The Grant Funding includes an amount of \$23,000 (net of GST) as a specific purpose grant used directly to fund the purchase of the new Gym Equipment.

These funds were used in a variety of outcomes including:

- ◆ Lifesavings administration, training and operations (\$30,728)
- General Operation (\$23,881)
- Building maintenance and operations (\$10,360)
- Juniors / Competition (\$2,537)
- ♦ Fundraising (\$6,550)



HENLEY SURF LIFESAVING CLUB ANNUAL REPORT 2008/2009 The net operating result of the Club after taking in account depreciation on the assets held by the Club of \$17,615 was an Operating Profit of \$84,729. This result was \$38,003 (\$15,003 ignoring the specific gym funding grant) above the result achieved in the previous year of \$46,276.

Included within this result was the trading account (Bar and Clothing) result of a Gross Profit of \$25,654. This result was above that recorded in 2007-08 of \$11,202 and is largely the result of the lower costs of operations (thanks to the amazing efforts of Sue and Kevin Fitzgerald) and improved clothing sales (as a result of the efforts of Lynne Tammita and Lee-Anne Folkers in the redesign of the clubs clothing range).

The year end balance retained within the investment and operating accounts and incorporating the building levy funding raised totals some \$101,000. This figure is improved if the reimbursement of a portion (\$50,000) for the capital cost of the building is taken into account.

The retention of a strong cash position within these accounts has been a focus for the Committee given the need to retain funds to ensure that the long term financial position of the Club is strong.

As Treasurer I am pleased to report that the committee continues to work together to ensure that it has a strong focus of its financial stewardship role.

The Club has a number of financial challenges to deal with in the future with the building program now likely to occur during the 2009-10 financial year.

Higher operating costs, the increasing numbers involved in activities and the need to ensure equipment standards are maintained will add continued stress to our on-going need to ensure consistent levels of funding are generated.


The increases membership numbers has played a significant part in income generation this past financial year. Last financial year members subscriptions generated some 33% of the direct costs (\$63,263) incurred to operate the club. I am pleased to report that this ratio has improved to a figure of some 40% for 2008-09 and reflects the importance of attracting and (importantly) maintaining high membership numbers. In this regard the efforts of the Junior Committee and the importance of the youth (HET) program (and the senior members who support this program) should not be ignored and in fact be applauded.

The building project will add increased financial pressures both during the construction phase and then in relation to the need to service and repay the additional borrowing required as a result of the project.

As we now embark on this major development the work undertaken during this last year to strengthen our financial position has in my opinion established a solid financial base for the club from which to move forward with this project. The continued support of all Members will however be essential in maintaining this position.

The report is provided for the consideration of Members.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year Ended 30 April 2009

Note 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The Financial Report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard, other mandatory professional requirements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (South Australia).

The Financial Report covers Henley SLSC as an individual entity. Henley SLSC is an association incorporated in South Australia under the Associations Incorporations Act.

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account the changing values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless other wise stated.

- (a) Income Tax The Association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997
- (b) Inventories Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value.
- (c) Property, Plant and Equipment The value of the Club's Non-Current Assets are reviewed annually by the Management Committee and they are of the opinion that the book value, after allowance for the current year's depreciation charge, represents fairly their carrying values.
- (d) Cash For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and at bank.
- (e) Revenue Revenue from the sale of goods is recognized upon delivery of goods to customers. Interest Revenue is recognized on the basis of the interest rate applicable to the financial assets. Revenue from rendering of a service is recognized upon the delivery of a service to customers. All revenue is net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).
- (f) Goods and Services Tax Revenues, expenses and assets are recognized net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognized as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

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






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
